CANDLELIGHTING

They will then proceed down the aisles, lighting the candle of the person at the end of each row. When your candle is lit, please pass the light to the person next to you. This treasured ritual symbolizes the light of Christ moving from the announcement of the Word (John 1:1-5) and spreading throughout the world. *HYMN 122
