Cedarkirk Church Retreat

MISSION OUTREACH

The atrocities in Ukraine and its millions of refugees are overshadowing most other needs right now.

Nonetheless, we have refugees from Afghanistan being resettled in our own backyard. Westminster

Communities is working currently to place 27 Afghan adults and children (four families) in St. Pete. Ten of the adults are now working for Westminster.

M I S S I O N ♥CORNER

Westminster is asking us to partner with them on three fronts:

(1) Computers. The refugees need 28 laptops or iPads to stay in touch with their loved ones in Afghanistan and to help with their English-speaking skills. First Presbyterian has six laptops that are gathering dust and will be donating those. If you have a laptop or iPad no longer being used, please consider donating to this cause (include the charger and mouse/pad if you have them.) The Mission Committee will make sure your personal data is wiped clean.

A goal of our church and Mission Committee is to involve more members and friends of FPC in projects, not just through monetary donations, but also via

donations of time, talent and effort. So, if you or anyone you know is proficient IT-wise and can give a Saturday to help wipe clean and retrofit any of the donated laptops and iPads, please contact Carlen Maddux (see contact info below). We'll work together in consultation with our media director Dave Aumack and schedule a Saturday we'll call Mission: *AfghanTech*. (Thank you, Dave!)

(2) Bicycle helmets. A benefactor in Orlando is paying for refurbishing used bicycles but not covering the helmets. The need: 12 adult and 12 child helmets. For safety reasons, new helmets are better than used. (Online prices of both helmets start at about \$20.)

(3) <u>Transportation</u>. If you are interested and able, families will need transportation once every 3 weeks or so to go to the grocery, drug store, etc. The families live in the Pinellas Point area of south St. Pete.

Johnny Miller will put buckets out in the sanctuary for the next few weeks for you to place the laptops/iPads and the bike helmets. (Thank you, Johnny!) MARK YOUR CALENDAR: If you would like to welcome our new Afghan neighbors, Westminster Communities and Lutheran Services will sponsor an Open House for the public on Thursday, May 5, 5:00-7:00 PM. It will be held at Westminster Palms, just north of our church, in its Tides Gallery (in the 14-story Palm View building, the tallest of the complex). Afghan hors-d'oeuvres will be served. Several refugees speak English, plus translators will be available.



In a world of disaster, hunger, and oppression, millions of people lack access to sustainable food sources, clean water, sanitation, education, and opportunity.

Typically received during the season of Lent, each gift to One Great Hour of Sharing supports efforts to relieve hunger (through the *Presbyterian Hunger Program*), promote development (through the *Presbyterian Committee on the Self-Development of People*), and assist in areas of disaster (through *Presbyterian Disaster Assistance*). The three programs all work in different ways to serve individuals and communities in need. From initial disaster response to ongoing community development, their work fits together to provide people with safety, sustenance, and hope.

GriefShare begins Sunday, April 24 at 4 PM and will be meeting virtually (via Zoom).



Whether your bereavement

experience is recent or not so recent, you will find encouragement, comfort and help in grieving the death of a spouse, child, parent, sibling, other family member, or friend. This program features biblical, Christ-centered teaching that focuses on grief topics associated with the death of a loved one. The 13-week DVD seminar features nationally respected grief experts and real-life stories of people, followed by a small group discussion about what was viewed. This is a

great opportunity to be around people who understand what you are feeling. Don't allow fear of what others may think to keep you from what could help you. Confidentiality is very much a part of this program.

Meal on Wheels - Volunteers Needed!

Meals on Wheels is a mission FPC has supported for over 50 years. Volunteers pick up and deliver meals to needy individuals from the Sunshine Center in


downtown St. Pete. We currently make about 12 stops, and the whole process from pick-up to return takes about two hours. We deliver five days a week and ask that people sign up for the same day every week or every other week.

We are currently in need of someone on the 1st, 3rd, and 5th Monday of the month, the 3rd and 4th Wednesday, and/or occasionally as a back-up driver. Volunteers will take a short training course and fill out paperwork before being able to deliver. Please call Kathy Bardin at (727) 418-4577 if you are interested or have any questions.
