

Easter lilies for the Chancel this Sunday have been donated by FPC members and friends in memory of or in honor of loved ones.



From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

My friends,

"Every Sunday is Easter Sunday." That was a song some of us learned. That reminds me we worship on Sundays because it was "early on the morning the first day of the week" that the women came and found the tomb of Jesus empty, the stone rolled back, Jesus' body gone. "Why do you seek the living among the dead?" the angel asked them: "He has risen." The first day of the week was such joy, such a life-changing event for followers of Jesus that they began to worship on that day: the first day of the week. Sunday, instead of the sabbath: Friday evening when the Jewish people worshiped.

You see, Easter shapes the Christian faith. It shapes each of us who seek Jesus. Easter tells us to be people of hope, of discovery, of joy. Certainly there is plenty to worry about in our lives, and in our world. I cannot close my heart to the tornadoes, the gunfire, the hungry children, the people grieving. I cannot forget that there are those who feel worthless, unloved, lost. I weep for them, and for the burdens we all feel in our lives and in our world.

But. But. Listen for the birds singing, for the alleluias emerging, for the good news about to break forth. He is not here. He has risen! And we rise with him. We rise into hope, into a life of meaning based on God's love for us, God's forgiveness of us, God's call for us to come follow Christ the risen Lord.

Early on the first day of the week the women came and found the stone rolled away and the tomb empty, for he had risen.

Come on Sunday or watch the service from where you are. Come say it with us: He has risen! He has risen indeed! Life can never be the same again. We are Easter people. Alleluia!

Also, volunteers are needed to read to kids at Lakewood Elementary and to help at the Free Clinic.

The Foundation for International Missions (FFIM) Honduras Medical Clinic was founded by members of FPC St. Pete. This 100% volunteer organization provides medical and dental care for the rural underserved people of Honduras (the second poorest

nation in the western Hemisphere after Haiti).

FFIM annual operating costs are partially funded through parking events at FPC. During these events, volunteers park cars in the three lots on the FPC property during concerts or events at nearby Vinoy Park. **We need new volunteers** to partner with the experienced veterans to either collect the parking fee as vehicles enter our lot or guide the vehicle driver to an open space. 
