MY FAVORITE QUARANTINE READ



Peace in the Last Third of Life A Handbook of Hope for Boomers *** PAUL F.M. ZAHL Like many, I keep several books working at the same time. One I aim to finish soon has just come out—*Peace in the Last Third of Life: A Handbook of Hope for Boomers* by Paul F.M. Zahl. This is the latest of several books written by Paul, a retired Episcopalian dean and priest. Its timing is uncanny, having come out at the start of the pandemic. Paul's writing style is easily readable, breezy yet serious; he's adept in weaving sturdy threads of theology through colorful loops of pop culture.

"OK Boomer," he opens his book with this somewhat dismissive meme that Millenials and younger generations use to mock certain of our attitudes, "our" being us Boomers and older at First Presbyterian and elsewhere.

From there Paul delves into the shadow that often hangs

over the last third of our lives. "The key...to peace and hope as the outcome of a person's physical life and journey is the resolution of unhealed, unresolved pain from the distant past. That is a maxim to underline and repeat." Paul writes out of his personal and pastoral counseling experience, which spanned five decades, while he lays out a few straightforward keys for resolving our unresolved pain.

This short book closes with a poignant, beautiful statement by J.M. Barrie (author of *Peter Pan*) describing his mother's death. Says Paul of Barrie's words: "Such is my hope for the last third of your life, O dearly beloved Boomer. Let alone my own."

Helen has traveled the globe promoting and supporting the business world for professional women.

Helen has been part of FPC since Dr. McClure was the pastor at "the old red brick building." Since taking the walk to the new church, she has been involved in singing in the choir, attending Sunday School, and playing the piano.
