# **Update from the Administrative Commission**

Greetings from your Administrative Commission! On Saturday August 14, 2021,

the Presbytery of Tampa Bay voted to appoint a group of teaching and ruling elders to serve as the Administrative Commission. This group is made up of the following seven ruling (RE) and teaching (TE) elders:

- TE Carl Lammers, Chapel in the Pines, Tampa

Our group will serve three purposes. Below you will find these purposes as well as a prayer request for each.

The first purpose is to have original jurisdiction only until the time that the session is able to achieve a quorum of elders, and that includes the responsibility of following the Book of Order and First Presbyterian policy for electing elders. At the same time, we want to emphasize that we highly value the dedication and experience of the existing session members. While we will be responsible for acting on matters that would ordinarily require the session to vote, we will be relying upon the session to inform and guide us while continuing to lead the church. The existing committee structures and staff responsibilities remain in place. Pray for clear communication and dedication to discerning God's will for the church.

Our second purpose is to expedite the hiring of an interim pastor. This role will continue until an interim pastor is hired. Again, we will be working closely with the session and what the Listening Team has heard from many of you to help shape our vision for a transitional pastor with the strengths best-suited for First Presbyterian. Pray for the Holy Spirit to guide the discernment of need and assessment of candidates.

Our third purpose is to continue the work of the Listening and Assessment team. This role includes conducting an administrative review and making final recommendations to both the session at First and the Presbytery's Commission on Ministry. Pray for perceptive eyes and ears to recommend a faithful way forward for First Presbyterian.



In 2018 when we made the partnership with Lakewood Elementary School as part of the Pinellas County Board of Education Transformation Zone the school's proficiency score was F.



In just three years, the students' performance has skyrocketed. This year the School's proficiency score is

<u>A</u> - wow!! Congratulations to the entire school: students, parents, faculty, staff, and the principal for their hard work! Special kudos to Mrs. Stephanie Woodford, the principal, for her hard work, dedication to the students, and her unfailing belief in their ability to succeed.

Mrs. Woodford has been promoted to Area Superintendent, with responsibility for 30 schools. Ms. Renee Nellenbach, formerly the vice-principal and partner with Mrs. Woodford in the school's turnaround, has been promoted to Principal of Lakewood Elementary School.

Thank you to everyone in the congregation for anything and everything you did to support the partnership. Things like donating to purchase school uniforms, volunteering to be a Lunch Pal, donating pizza lunch to the Quarterback Boys Club, taking the boys and their sponsor to a Rays game, donating foodstuffs for Thanksgiving grocery bags for 80 families, donating to the Christmas Angel Tree, donating to purchase t-shirts for the weekly assembly for students whose parents were unable to purchase them, donating to purchase t-shirts for honor roll students, donating to support enrolling Lakewood in the One School, One Book program, baking cupcakes for teachers and delivering them to the school, praying for the faculty, staff, students, and their families, volunteering to support the school's choir, purchasing items for students from the Walmart registry, and so much more!
