

We would like to create a volunteer Host Homes program for those who will need to move to a non-evacuation area, may have pets (members can offer if they are willing to take pets), or have other needs that will require special consideration.

MY FAVORITE QUARANTINE READ



I would like to recommend a trilogy of hiking thrillers with a very personal connection. My college roommate married a fellow who spent most of his life working in sales, but in retirement turned to writing. It is a long path for all new writers, but Ray Anderson has had success. As they suggest writing about what you know best, Ray developed this trilogy by focusing on his love of hiking and spun his tales along the trail.

In the first book, *The Trail*, the protagonist hikes the Appalachian Trail in the East from start to finish, with amazing things happening along the way. In Ray's second book, *Sierra*, Awol and his dog, Blazer, hike the Pacific Coast Trail from Mexico to Canada, again finding mystery and adventure along the trail. His third book, which is due to be

released in August, finds Awol completing the series of major trails to hike in the United States. This time he is on the Continental Divide - no qualifiers needed. You know there will be trouble, and Awol will be there to help resolve it.

Yes, I did get advance copies of his books, as all authors need devoted friends to read and report back to them. What an honor to be asked to do something like this! Even more than

the adventure story, I have just loved learning about hiking - how to plan and prepare for a major hike, what to bring, how to survive, trail names, and so much more. I know big major hikes are not for me at this stage of life! But, reading about it is a very pleasant way to spend a summer day!

Ray usually comes to visit us every winter as he spends the winter months writing on the east coast of Florida. I'm hoping that he'll be able to come next winter and talk to us about his newest book. This is it, though, I think for Awol and his thrillers. Ray has moved on to Sci Fi! No details yet, but Ray is in talks with major networks about turning these trail books into a made-for-TV series!
