From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

Dear Friends:

We have been reading Galatians 5:22-23 every Sunday for seven weeks: two more to go! I got tickled when Dottie Young read the text last Sunday and asked, "Does that sound familiar?" and some of you chuckled. Yes, it should sound familiar! We have read those two verses Sunday after Sunday: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.

It's a little like a mental/ spiritual checklist. How am I doing on the Fruits of the Spirit? I may need to work on patience this week.... Or on kindness....

I like that it's fruits. I find myself thinking about plants and trees, growing, flourishing, and bearing fruit. That's us in our faith: we are growing, flourishing, and finally, hopefully, bearing fruit. Plants and trees don't bear fruit without sunlight, water, and without birds, bees, and wind to pollinate and spread the seeds. We, too, are nurtured in our faith by what we do, the friends we keep, the way we interact with the world around us, the way we listen to God.

A week or so ago I was with my Connecticut grandsons, now 9 and 11. They have grown so much: not just physically, but mentally and emotionally. They don't fuss with each other the way they used to. They tell you what they like, what bothers them, what they are thinking about. Grandparenting them is

different now, in some ways easier, in some ways more challenging. And they are a joy!

Our faith is like that. It grows. It faces challenge. It bears fruit. ... love, joy, peace, patience.... And the list goes on. Probably you can say it in your sleep. Remember to NURTURE that faith, and let it grow to sustain you in hard times, and offer it as fruit to nourish others around you.

Help That's Truly WANTED and NEEDED

The Edible Peace Patch

"To cultivate healthy minds and bodies through hands-on educational gardens." That's the motto of the R'Club's Edible Peace Patch. Do you like to teach? Do you enjoy gardening? This may be the

opportunity just for you. Young hungry minds and bodies need your help. The Edible Peace Patch, which was begun in 2009 by several Eckerd College students, now works with eight Title 1 elementary schools in St. Pete, schools working with lower-income kids. Plus, there's one community garden. The schools' curricula are approved by the Pinellas County School Board.



"The children working with these gardens are seeing their science scores improve significantly," says FPC's Lynne Mormino. "These gardens are a real morale booster."

There are two ways you can get involved:

• First, you can help these children plant and/or weed their gardens on a weekly basis from August to May from 9 AM to noon. (With the current

temperatures you may consider starting in a later month.) You can check the weekly <u>volunteer</u> calendar to see what school has a workday available.

• Or secondly, you can be a garden education volunteer to help teach a hands-on class of elementary children in their garden. This is an 8-week commitment, once a week for 45 minutes each time.

St. Petersburg Free Clinic

Volunteers to log in persons needing food, medical and dental help and financial help; volunteers to serve as client advocates; volunteers to pack up non-perishable foods; volunteers to pack up snack bags; volunteers to help with walk-in clients and drive-throughs.
