Update from the Presbytery of Tampa Bay Administrative Commission

Greetings from your Administrative Commission!

This week we had an extremely smooth and productive meeting alongside the session, which is further evidence that the work of your church continues! We are impressed by the continued dedication of the session members despite these difficult times.

On Tuesday, the AC met again to discuss our strategy for hiring a transitional pastor. Hiring of an interim pastor usually takes 4-6 months, but our goal is to have a pastor in place at First Presbyterian by October 1st. This process involves writing narrative descriptions of the congregation's current status as well as the congregation's needs in a transitional pastor. We have 5 candidates

that Patrice Hatley has pre-screened for our evaluation, and we hope to review those candidates in the next few weeks and subsequently begin the interview process.

Please pray that our eyes, ears, and hearts be tuned into the Holy Spirit's direction for First Presbyterian Church so that we might find a strong transitional pastor to lead you into a fruitful mission life ahead.

Update from Dr. Cesar Davila, New Hope Clinic, Honduras My family and I are very well, thanks to the Lord. The [COVID-19] cases in Honduras and in the communities of Orica continue to escalate in an unparalleled way. It is suspected that we have the "delta variable" because of the aggressive and highly contagious nature. Again the health care professionals are making the news in spite of two doses of vaccine. Last week a doctor died and three more are gravely ill in the hospital. All had had both doses of vaccine. Because of this they are thinking about the possibility of adding a third dose for the medical personnel.

The cases of COVID in children and pregnant women are happening more frequently; at the start of the pandemic it was rare to see cases in this population.

Among the communities that we serve from the New Hope Clinic, those having the most cases are Orica, Santa Cruz, Joya de Quebracho, Guatemalita and el Naranjo. [These are all communities that mission teams routinely visit to do health screenings.]

Vaccines are beginning to arrive in the country thanks to donations from international organizations and primarily from donations from the USA government. The vaccine campaigns are beginning to bring hope to the population that is alarmed about the level of contagion and deaths that occur daily.

We continue to take all necessary precautions to avoid contagion and we thank the Lord that we are protected day after day. Thank you very much for all your prayers.
