
seminary is located in Wolfeboro, New Hampshire.


When a hurricane threatens and an evacuation is ordered, church members living in evacuation areas have options such as a hotel/motel, or they can evacuate out of town if they leave soon enough. The best choice is to evacuate to a friend or family's home in a non-evacuation area of our community.

We would like to create a volunteer Host Homes program for those who will need to move to a non-evacuation area, may have pets (members can offer if they are willing to take pets), or have other needs that will require special consideration.

Once these are completed, we will work to match hosts and guests, and, of course, there will be an opportunity to speak to each other to see if this match would work. We will also keep the information on file at the church via a spreadsheet and we will update the following year as needed.

MY FAVORITE QUARANTINE READ



My reading list is not usually "best sellers" or "hot books of the month." I frequent used book stores and thrift shops. My latest find is THE FIRST MAN IN ROME by Colleen McCullough, whose 1983 book THE THORNBIRDS mesmerized a generation. I chose this book because I like historical novels and McCullough reeled me in.

This story, which takes place in 110 B.C., deals with the lives of two men, Marius and Sulla. They were opposites who became friends, brothers-in-law, and trusted companions. Their histories and inner goals for life and career support each other toward a remarkable end.

This part of history in Rome was the foundation of Democracy. The struggles and political combat are the

foundation of what we know today. It was interesting to read about the political maneuvers and compare to politics today. Many of the stories, with just a few name changes, could be items we would read in today's newspapers.

The military strategies were amazing and opened my eyes to a world I would never have believed possible. Their everyday lives, and why we do what we do today, are exhibited in their daily lives. This book is one of the best history lessons I have ever experienced.

It is a long book and I need a break before taking on part 2, THE GRASS CROWN. But I find myself anxious to continue the saga.
