

Praise Band Preview - Something New!




As a reminder, we will begin the organ prelude just before 10 AM, so please plan to arrive a few minutes early!

Important Update from the Presbytery of Tampa Bay Listening and Assessment Team

From Elder Stacey Quick Chair of the Listening and Assessment Team

On behalf of the Listening and Assessment Team, I want to thank you for the time we have had with you in our initial round of listening sessions. Your love for one another and your community shines clearly. The future of First Presbyterian Church of St. Petersburg is bright.

On July 26, we communicated our early recommendations with the session. Our first recommendation was to fast-track the hiring of a transitional pastor. The session voted to request an administrative commission from the Presbytery to find and hire a transitional pastor with the skills necessary to guide First St. Pete in its next chapter of ministry.

Upon further research this week, it has come to our attention that, as a result of session member resignations, the session is unable to achieve a quorum (minimum number of members to act). During this temporary situation, the Presbytery will be asked by the Commission on Ministry to appoint an administrative commission to act as the session until such time as a quorum of the session can be restored following the church's Nominating Committee policy and the provisions of G-2.0403 regarding preparation for ministry as a ruling elder. Once the session is able to achieve a quorum, full power will be restored to the session and the administrative commission will continue its work to hire a transitional pastor and complete the work of the Listening and Assessment Team.

Please note that this action is not being recommended in response to anything other than the lack of a quorum, and full jurisdiction is not expected to last very long.



etc., or birth in the family. Evelyn oversees the organization of the meals and their delivery which will include an entrée or casserole, vegetables, rolls and dessert.


Two things to consider:
