




Day School personnel are planning on a September 8 opening. God is great!

"At the young age of two, I was singing, *At the Cross* not knowing what I was singing," explained Vivian when asked about her early musical experience. She was taught by her mother and father to sing, and ever since, her life has been filled with music.

Because of this early experience, her parents paid for piano lessons when she was seven years old. During the Depression, her parents paid 50 cents for each piano lesson. Vivian attended a Christian College where she majored in music and trained to become an opera, gospel, and concert soloist. She and her husband travelled all over the United States singing gospel music for 38 years. During this time, she became an ordained Deacon in the Free Methodist Church. Vivian has been attending FPC since 1990 and has enjoyed singing in our church choir.

When asked about her life, Vivian softly said, "I accepted Jesus when I was eight years old, and I have had some tough times, but He has always given me peace and joy."




A flugelhorn solo "Revelation Song" was presented during last Sunday's service by Kevin Clark, who was accompanied by Jack Rain on the piano
