## From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

Dear Friends,

You all seemed to enjoy my donning a brown shepherd head cloth at worship last Sunday, December 10. I know I probably looked silly, which isn't always a bad thing. I get that. Anyway, I have been talking with the children (and everybody) about our family-friendly 4:00 Christmas Eve service, suggesting what headgear the children might choose to wear during the Nativity part of the service. I love that young Wesley wanted to put on one of the shepherd cloths too, He was really cute! Then when I took mine off, he took his off too. He is so dear, and that he was doing what I did was such a compliment!

We are so blessed with the children who come, and bring pictures they drew or bracelets they made, and share their stories, their ideas, their questions. I am just blown away by them, as you might be too.

And I wanted to share the following precious story with you: one more way you, as a church, are making a difference in our community. Listen to Jeannie Doddridge's account:

FIRST CHURCH SERVES THE HOMELESS COMMUNITY EACH MONTH

Six FPC folk ventured out in the rain to serve at Missio Dei, a Presbyterian

worshiping community for the homeless in St. Pete. Here's a report on the experience they had on December 10:

We picked up the 7 pans of food cooked by our marvelous Men's Ministry Team, and we also took 7 boxes of stockings to deliver. Thanks to Diane Zuercher, Marilyn Mulcahy, and the crew of Sailboat 33703+ for providing 60+ filled Christmas stockings.

There were more people at Missio Dei than usual; they were participating with Rev. Sam Picard in his Bible Study and Celebration of Communion. The physical building could be described as a bit dingy, but all of us found shelter in it. There was fellowship, protection from the rain, food for the hungry and Christmas Stockings! Taking a break from serving salads, Jennie and I sat and visited with the homeless, talking about Christmas Carols and favorite musicians and memories of the past.

One lady, maybe in her 60's, shared that this was the first Christmas stocking she had ever received. I resisted the urge to give her another, fearing it would take away from that special feeling of receiving her first. As we were leaving, we saw her riding off on a bike into the dark rainy night with another meatloaf dinner for later and her first Christmas stocking.

It takes a lot of people to make this ministry happen each month, but it matters. Thanks for all you do, with this mission and the many other missions we support as a church!



Remember The Little Free Library on your Christmas list


