UPDATED FPC Mask Policy

Beloved Members and Friends,



This is to let you know the Session has reinstated a mandatory mask mandate for worship at First Presbyterian beginning with our Christmas Eve services. We have done this at the recommendation of the Return to Church Task Force. Both the Task Force and the Session are committed to keep our people safe, and we are watching the COVID statistics as information becomes available.

Our joyous Christmas Eve services will be held in the sanctuary as planned. As of this moment, the only change is the mandate for masking, with the suggestion that worshippers observe social distancing as they are able. We have also asked the choir to wear masks, except that they have to option to remove masks during anthems or other special featured pieces.

Once again: please stay both safe and hopeful, as we follow recommendations. The church will continue to monitor the COVID situation and will make any other changes if and when they prove necessary.

On Friday, December 10th, winds came in the night and leveled out many areas in central USA. Tornados touched down and devastated areas across 6 states, ranked as the longest tornado track in US history. Mayfield, Kentucky got the worst of it, as you may have seen on the news. The death toll is up to 74, and first responders are still sifting through the rubble.

This hits me (Pastor Megan) on another level, because my dear friend, Mason, was the pastor of First Presbyterian Church, Mayfield from 2012-14 and it was completely destroyed (photo below). They are in touch with church members about immediate needs on a day-to-day basis right now. I know we're all hearing from all over the place about ways to help in KY, but I thought I'd share what I'm being told by people on the ground.



First, please go make a donation to Presbyterian Disaster Relief as they have already been in touch with First Presbyterian Church in Mayfield and will be on the ground shortly. You can give online HERE.

Next, if you'd like to contribute to food resources (click HERE to donate), a local volunteer is a part of Mercy Chefs, who is on the ground. Mercy Chefs is providing hot meals and bottled water to anyone and

everyone who needs to eat. It's cold in Mayfield right now and people don't have heat.

Here is the most recent list from my friend:


- *new* clothes (not used)
