WORSHIP THIS SUNDAY

Join us for our 10 AM Worship Service In-Person and Online this Sunday, December 6 Second Sunday of Advent

This Sunday's Sermon: "Tidings of Comfort & Joy"

Scripture: Mark 1:1-8, Psalm 85:1-2; 8-13, Isaiah 40:1-11

As a reminder, we will begin the organ prelude just before 10 AM, so whether you plan to attend in person or online, please join us a few minutes early! When the organ music starts, please observe respectful quiet as those around you use the time for prayer and preparation for worship.

COMMUNION SUNDAY: We will be celebrating the Lord's Supper this Sunday during our worship service.

- If you are worshipping with us online, please gather bread, crackers, or rolls and something to drink (juice, wine, milk, water) ahead of time for all in your home who will be participating.
- If you are worshipping with us in person, here's what to expect:

When you check in on Sunday morning, you will receive small pre-packaged communion kit. Take it with you to your seat. When Pastor Dawn asks you to, remove the clear plastic top, revealing the wafer. Later, you will remove the second top and drink the juice. After the service, make sure to dispose of the remains in the garbage cans at the exit.

For those who need gluten-free wafers, you will receive a gluten-free wafer in a sealed bag. Use this when you take the bread. Discard the wafer from the kit, which IS NOT gluten free.

information about joining the meeting including the link for the Zoom meeting.



The Girl from Berlin by Ronald Balson





needed...even Radar!



Here Are Instructions For Attending In-Person Worship In The Sanctuary

If you attend in person, please remember:

You will need to reserve a spot to attend. There are two ways to register:

- (1) Go online! An email will be sent to you each Monday morning with a link to click to RSVP for the upcoming Sunday. You will also find a RSVP button on the main page of our website, or you can go directly to fpcstpete.com/rsvpforsunday. Please complete ALL boxes, then click "Submit to RSVP" **OR**
- (2) Call the Church Office (727-822-2031) Monday through Friday between 9 a.m. and noon. You will be asked a series of questions; some will be health-related. All information collected will be kept confidential. No reservations will be accepted after Friday at noon, and voicemail messages are not RSVPs. If you aren't able to RSVP, we are accepting walkins on Sunday morning as space is available.
 - Remember: You will be required to wear a mask. If you forget one, we will have extras available.
 - Hand sanitizer will be available in several easy-to-access spots for your safety.
 - Please note that the elevator will NOT be accessible.
 - The sanctuary will have **one entrance** and **one exit** <u>only</u>. Signs will point you in the right direction.
 - For your safety, prior to service, you will check in at the front doors, and be seated by ushers at a safe social distance.
 - We ask that you do not congregate in the sanctuary at all after the service. If you wish to stop and visit with friends, make your way out of the sanctuary first and visit outside. We want you to spend as little time inside the sanctuary as possible.

Thank you in advance for your patience with these new procedures. We look forward to meeting for in-person worship while maintaining the safest environment possible!
