From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

Dear Friends,

We have entered the season of Lent. More than 80 folks came to the church on Wednesday to receive bread and cup for communion and a mark of ashes on their forehead: from dust we have come, to dust we will ga This reminds us of a number of things: our mortality, that we are part of the substance of all things, that we are ourselves created by God as all things have been created by God, destined, in the end, to become once again part of all things, the earth and of God's own spirit. Is that depressing? On the contrary for me that is reassuring. I am part of God's creation, which God said was 'good, very good."

For Lenten worship, we will be reading scriptures that describe the covenant God established with creation and with God's people. We will read this week about the rainbow, how it is a sign of God's covenant. We will later read about God's covenant with Abraham, and the later New Covenant in Jeremiah. A covenant is a legal promise, a commitment. We will be learning how it was God who established the promises with us, God who is partner with us in covenant. And we will read about Jesus' journey that takes him to the ultimate gift on the cross in Jerusalem.


Meanwhile you may be receiving the daily Lenten devotional readings. I enjoyed the one this morning by Jackson Ringley (New York, NY) that spoke of stories, particularly in the theater, and said: Jesus understands the value of a good story. His ministry is one of narrative and nurture, and he reminds us that the stories we tell – and why we tell them – matter deeply....Jesus shows us through parables and speeches that stories have the power to change the world.

Let's get busy on this journey, doing what we can, with Jesus, to change the world.



SNEAKERS & SOX MISSION SUNDAY This Sunday, February 18, 2024 10:00 - 11:00 AM

Lakewood Elementary School has been telling our Mission Committee for a while now that many of its students have a real need for sneakers. So our committee decided to see if we at First Presbyterian are able to do an all-in, can-do

effort and donate 160 pairs. All kids' sizes are needed, boys and girls, from size 5 to 12.











We're asking for three things from our generous members:

- 1. Kids' Sneakers
- 2. Money for Socks

3. To help us box and pack the sneakers during our next Mission Sunday, February 18. We will do this between the two services, from 10-11 AM.

Let's first discuss the boxing and packing. We need as many hands as possible to help us box and pack during our next **Mission Sunday, February 18. Time 10-11am**, the hour between our two services. Our Fellowship Committee has graciously offered to provide light refreshments.

Where? Fellowship Hall.

(P.S. The Mission Committee has learned its lesson: At the previous Mission Sunday we didn't wait for church members to show up while we did much of the work with little left for others to do. From now on, we'll help organize and assist but let you do the work. Scout's honor.)

<u>Now let's talk socks</u>. Rather than ask members to buy socks individually at a higher price, we're asking you to contribute \$money\$ so the committee can purchase the socks in bulk.



Finally, the sneakers. To make sure our generous members don't all accidentally contribute one size—say, size 5 boys—a board will be at each service with tabs on it that you can pull off. This tab will designate a shoe size and kind (boy or girl) for you to purchase.

Select whatever color you like. And take as many tabs as you like!

What to do with the sneakers? You can bring your sneakers to church prior to February 18. Bins labeled *Lakewood Sneakers* will be available beneath the Giving Tree at each service for you to place them in. If you would like to contribute money for the socks, please place your check in the offering plate, made out to First Presbyterian; <u>Memo line: *Lakewood socks*</u>. **Or**, you can deposit cash or check made to FPC in an envelope attached to the tab board.



Thanks to each of you for your generous spirit. Let's see if we can reach our goal of 160 kids' sneakers!

Standing on the Promises: The Woodson African-American Museum of Florida on the Historic Gas Plant Site by Terri Lipsey Scott, Executive Director of the Carter G. Woodson African-American Museum. Come learn the history of this cultural asset and the exciting plans for the future of the museum, which is named for the founder of Black History Month, Dr. Carter G. Woodson. Mrs. Lipsey Scott is a retired administrator who served in the Office of the St. Petersburg Mayor and City Council.

- MARCH 20: The Dynamic History of St. Petersburg's Marine Science Complex by Peter R. Betzer, PhD, Founding Dean Emeritus of the College of Marine Science at USF. - <u>APRIL 17</u>: *From Folk Medicines to Therapeutic Drugs by Akiko Tanaka PhD, president, and co-founder of The Tampa Bay Research Institute (TBRI).* TBRI has spent over 40 years investigating the relationship between viruses, cancers, and the functioning of the immune system. As a result of our research, TBRI has uncovered the details of the healing properties of an ancient folk medicine – an extract of pinecones. Our ongoing studies have now brought forth new synthetic molecules that are being developed into lifesaving immune-altering therapeutics.

Beach Drive Forums are monthly conversations for the community with intriguing speakers on thought-provoking topics. Wednesdays from 5:30-7:30 PM in Fellowship Hall (doors open at 5:30, presentation at 6:00). Refreshments and Q&A included. Open to the public; best parking is the church lot off N. Shore Drive.

We are now accepting applications for college scholarships! These scholarships include the Ohrns Scholarship for undergraduates and the Osborn Scholarship for Theology

students. We only require one application is for both Fall 2024 and Spring 2025 semesters (awards are split); the applicant needs to let us know if they only need it for one semester.

- 1. a completed application form;
- 2. a copy of your most recent high school or college transcript;
- 3. a 500-word essay describing your involvement in church-related activities as well as extra-curricular and community involvement activities, why you

want this grant, and what you expect to do following the completion of your education.

The Scholarship Committee will review the applications and the Session will approve the final awards. Successful applicants will be asked to provide proof of enrollment and acceptance by their educational institution. Funds for the scholarship will be sent directly to the institution so be sure to give the proper name and address to which the funds are to be sent. Questions?
