Mission Spotlight: Beth-El Farmworker Ministry

Located on a 27-acre parcel of land on U.S. Highway 301 about 20 miles south of Tampa, Beth-El Farmworker Ministry serves migrant farm workers and their families. Migrant workers are amongst the poorest of the working poor who often battle with nutrition-related illnesses while struggling to feed, house, and educate their families.

Beth-El serves the farm worker community by providing opportunities for hunger relief, education, healthcare, and spiritual growth. This year, Beth-El will focus efforts toward building personal health as our nation works to heal from the pandemic. Emphasis will be on fresh and healthy foods and acquiring a larger refrigerator so that the food pantry can be expanded.

First Presbyterian Church of St. Petersburg continues to support Beth-El Ministry with financial contributions. What else can you do?





Lent Small Group Study Holy Conversation: Talking About God in Everyday Life



If you'd like to be in fellowship with a small group of Christians (no more than 12) who will learn about talking about God in everyday life, you are invited to participate in the Lenten Study: *Holy Conversation.*

This study is about equipping us to be more conversational and comfortable in sharing our faith with friends, family, and colleagues. We know that Jesus wants us to share the Good News. But how do we do it?

The first Zoom meeting will take place next **Monday, February 22nd at 2 p.m.** and will meet weekly. This study is based on the book *Holy Conversation: Talking About God in Everyday Life,* by Richard Pearce. Learning happens in the study through a weekly group time of study, reading the book (about 10 minutes per session), and practicing what you've learned with a conversation partner which can take as much or little time as you set aside for it. This study will be facilitated by Ruling Elder, Lynn Kiehne, Pastor Dawn, and Pastor Megan.

Grieving? Know someone who is? GriefShare begins March 7 at 4 PM (meeting via Zoom)

Whether your bereavement experience is recent or not so recent, you will find encouragement, comfort and help in grieving the death of a spouse, child, parent, sibling, other family member, or friend.

This program features biblical, Christ-centered teaching that focuses on grief topics associated with the death of a loved one. The 13-week DVD seminar features nationally respected grief experts and real-life stories of people, followed by a small group discussion about what was viewed. This is a great opportunity to be around people who understand what you are feeling. Don't allow fear of what others may think to keep you from what could help you. We will be accepting applications for college scholarships February 1st through March 3rd. These scholarships include the D T Michael Scholarship and the Ohrns Scholarship for undergraduates and the Osborne Scholarship for Theology students.


For further details about these scholarships, please contact the Church Office. To apply for any of these scholarships, you will need to include: 1) a completed application form (found <u>HERE</u>); 2) a copy of your most recent high school or college transcript; 3) a 500-word essay describing your involvement in church-related activities as well as extracurricular and community involvement activities, why you want this grant, and what you expect to do following the completion of your education.

The Scholarship Committee will review the applications and the Session will approve the

final awards. Successful applicants will be asked to provide proof of enrollment and acceptance by their educational institution. Funds for the scholarship will be sent directly to the institution so be sure to give the proper name and address to which the funds are to be sent.
