We will be joined by GUEST SOLOIST, Chris Romeo, this Sunday!



From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

Dear Members and Friends at First Presbyterian Church,

Not long ago I sent a letter asking you to consider making a financial pledge to First Presbyterian Church for the 2023 budget year. As God has moved among us at the end of 2022, we saw amazing things happen with the church budget: an encouraging reduction in the budget deficit for the year just ended and more in pledges for 2023 than we are dared to hope!

In real terms:

- THE DEFICIT we expected for 2022 was \$235,000, BUT the year-end report shows a loss of only \$117,000! Such wonderful news!
- Last year's budget was built on \$345,000 in pledges, BUT our actual yearend giving total for 2022 was \$450,000. More great news!
- Pledges for 2023 are almost but not quite \$500,000!

We still have a long way to go as we strengthen this church, but this good budget news reflects the energy and enthusiasm I am feeling around the church. Let me take a moment to THANK each of you for your thoughtful and generous 2023 pledges. Your commitment to the church and your financial giving enable us to continue to bring the message, love, and joy of Jesus Christ to the St. Petersburg community.

If any of you have not had a chance to offer your pledge for this year, it is not too late. All gifts, of whatever size, are signs of our commitment to Christ, and of our intention to walk together in this ministry. I am grateful to you, as is the Church Session. Thank you.

Five Questions for Rev. Jeanie Barnes

For a PK, or Preacher's Kid, Jeanie Barnes defies the stereotype. She became a minister herself. And she's currently serving as our Parish Associate for Community Life and Worship. Jeanie was born in Pakistan where her parents were missionaries. Her grandparents also were missionaries in India, when "my grandfather had the opportunity to visit with Gandhi—his pacifism was influential on my parents." Specifically, Jeanie was born in Lahore, Pakistan, in a hospital on the college campus where years later our Dr. Peter Armacost served as president.

"I grew up in Pakistan and India, where I attended a missionary boarding school." From there, she jumped halfway around the world to attend college at the University of the Pacific in Stockton, CA, and was able to spend a year abroad in Japan. She graduated with a Liberal Arts degree. As for the emphasis of that degree, you'll have to ask her, she had such a variety of interests.



As you know by now the Personnel & Administration Committee shares a brief profile of our staff members the week of their birthdays. Jeanie's birthday is today, Friday February 3.

"I needed to find a paying job, so I subsequently earned a bachelor's degree in teaching at the University of Kansas (in Lawrence)." She met future husband Greg when introduced by a mutual friend. "Greg and I next crossed paths in Ohio. After several such serendipitous meetings, we finally got the message." Jeanie and Greg have one daughter, who

is married, and two grandsons.

Jeanie earned her seminary degree at the St. Paul School of Theology in Kansas City. "I finally decided I could be a pastor after being the only chaplain on call at a hospital one night when I had to deal with seven people dying."

We'd like to ask you a few questions, Jeanie, if we may?

Q1: What was the first church you served in?

Jeanie: It was a small, 100-member church in King City, MO (population 1,000 when they were there). I was the solo pastor. It was a beautiful red-brick church in a wonderful farming community a couple hours north of Kansas City, which several Scottish families had settled. Greg and I were there nine years. He was the mayor of King City for a while, and I was on the school board. This small church was such a contrast to the next church I served in Prairie Village,

KS, which had 6,000 members and where I was one of three Associate Pastors in the Pastoral Care department. We ultimately moved to Tampa to be near our daughter and her family.

Q2: What do you enjoy doing here at First Presbyterian?

Jeanie: I love the engagement with our members and staff. I loved fixing up the room for our children. Really, I enjoy everything I've gotten to do so far. And I love preaching out of that big pulpit.

Q3: What's your favorite dish?


Jeanie: Greg loves my Japanese dish called 'donburi.' Named for the large bowl it's served in called a 'don,' it's steamed rice, veggies, and sauce. And then I pour and steam a beaten egg over the top of it.

Q4: What are your hobbies?

Jeanie: During the pandemic I really got into Zentangle art. Well, it starts out Zentangle, but then it evolves into something unique. Animal and music spirits keep wanting voice as well. I also enjoy making Japanese pottery and doing nature photography.

Q5: By the way, Jeanie, you've lived in a lot of places, overseas as well as in the States. Just how many languages do you speak and/or know?

Jeanie: I grew up jabbering like a native in Urdu and


Clover has a new friend!



Our church will host a "Hope for Ukraine" Concert on Saturday, March 25. This performance will be presented by the Kyiv Symphony Orchestra and Chorus.




