#### We will be joined by GUEST SOLOIST, Todd Donovan, this Sunday at the 11 AM service!




American Bass-Baritone, Todd William Donovan, has been described by critics as a singer full of confidence, dominating the stage. He is known for his powerful and resonant voice and expressive acting. Mr. Donovan is comfortable both on the Opera and Musical Theater stage where he has performed throughout the United States. Mr. Donovan has sung at the Classical Music Festival in Eisenstadt, Austria for eight seasons.

Mr. Donovan's musical theater experience includes the roles of Amile de Becque in Rodgers and Hammerstein's *South Pacific*, Alfred P. Doolittle in *My Fair Lady*, the Baker in Sondheim's *Into the Woods*, and Count Carl Magnus in A Little Night Music, and The Beast in Disney's Beauty and the Beast.

Some of Mr. Donovan's operatic roles include: Figaro in Mozart's *The Marriage of Figaro*, Leporello in *Don Giovanni*, Olin Blitch in Floyd's *Susannah* (Naxos Records 2014 DVD), Scarpia in Puccini's *Tosca*, and Mefistofele in Boito's *Mefistofele*.

#### From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

Dear Friends,

This coming week, January 22, I'll let you know a little about how I am trying to "go deeper" in my own faith journey and as your pastor. I'll be preaching out of Paul's letter to the church in Corinth, and from the story of Jesus calling some guys to follow him. They left their boats and nets and their fishing behind to discover a new life with Jesus. How do we do that? How do we let ourselves be open to change, to follow Jesus, and to go deeper in our faith?

BUT ONE MORE THING. A confession: I FORGOT to announce about the Pancakes! We are having a pancake breakfast next week -- <u>Sunday 1/29 at 9:00 a.m.</u> I can't believe that I forgot to announce this last Sunday. (Maybe I wanted more pancakes for myself! I do like to eat breakfast, especially pancakes!)

Anyway, as many of you know, on Fifth Sundays we have celebrated MissionSunday, with a mission project we could do together as a congregation and usually a meal. This time we are FOCUSING ON CHILDREN: gathering diapers and baby wipes and children's books. These will be distributed to agencies and/or schools in our area and will make a big difference for families in need, and for children who don't have books. Please plan to bring these items to the church that day or any time before then. The Men's Meal Ministry team will be cooking stacks of pancakes for us to enjoy; the Praise Band will sing some of their best worship songs while we gather and eat; children from St. Petersburg Primary School will sing some of their songs for us in Fellowship Hall. After, as we complete our work, we can go up to the Sanctuary for worship with the organ and the choir at 11:00.

This is our first MissionSunday since we began having two separate and different services. Last year (May, July and October) we combined our MissionSunday events: worship, mission project and meal into our (one) Fellowship Hall space. This time we will do it differently, with the pancake breakfast and mission project in the Fellowship Hall, and formal worship upstairs at 11 AM. Those who especially like to attend the Connect service will miss their 9 AM service, but we will be "connecting" with good food, important service work, toe-tapping, hand-clapping music, and a chance to connect with each other in this Christ-filled way. I hope you will bring diapers, wipes or children's books to share and join us on Sunday January 29 for some of the important mission work of our church. It will be a spirit-filled way for us to gather together.

# Surrounding FPC With Prayer

Did you feel something special Monday afternoon? It might have been the prayers uplifted around the church campus! During the day of celebration of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., nine members and staff of First Presbyterian Church, led by Parish Associate Jeanie Barnes, circled the church campus with prayer. The prayer walk stopped at various places inside and

outside First Presbyterian, with a different person leading prayers of thanks, protection and guidance for the future for each location. Prayer stops included the church office, playground, St. Pete Primary School, the parking lot, Presbyterian Women's room, choir rooms, men's Bible Study and Alcoholics Anonymous room, Fellowship Hall, the Church Garden, the chapel and sanctuary. The spirit of God was present as fond memories of some made new knowledge for others:

- The stained glass ribbon windows in the chapel were salvaged from a church in South Florida that was being demolished; the late Chris Lee (daughter of Lillian Harris) tracked down the stained glass and the late Glenn Schlecht had a hand in storing and installing.
- The history of First Presbyterian Church is told in the chapel in needlepoint depictions made by church members.
- St. Pete Primary is thriving, and in the hearts of alumni parents who were on the walk, with one whose graduate is now 46 years old.
- The Presbyterian Women's room was once home to the beloved Highlander Sunday School class.
- The parking lot is a lucrative source of income for the New Hope Clinic in Honduras and the Foundation for International Missions as members collect parking donations for frequent downtown events.

If you haven't explored your church campus, check it out. And say a prayer along the way!




### Items needed from members and friends to be sorted and distributed:

**10:00 AM** or thereabouts: Children, parents, grandparents and otherwise will begin decorating the backpacks and filling them with books. We'll also be stuffing and sorting for distribution the diapers and wipes.

11:00 AM: We'll move to the Sanctuary for our worship service. Please Note: There will be only one service on January 29th.

on the first Monday of the month, February 6th, in Room N-123, at 7:00 p.m.


