

From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

Dear Friends,

You might remember that last year we did a study of Joan Gray's book *Sailboat Church*. That book and study have shaped some of our language and understanding of ministry, as we moved away from seeing ministry as the constant work of row-row-rowing a boat. Instead, as Joan Gray suggests, we see ministry as like a sailboat, working in partnership with God, watching for how the Holy Spirit's wind directs and empowers the church's ministry. There is still plenty of work to do (ask any sailor), but it is done in a spirit of prayer. The church is listening for God's directing, knowing the journey may take us someplace new. It may not be what we expected. But it will be the experience of a lifetime!

Last fall, at a visioning event, I handed out some coloring pages that featured sailboats. We posted some of the colored pages in our worship spaces (in the Sanctuary and the Youth Center). Earlier this week, when I took those pictures down, I noticed again that some of these brilliantly colored sailboats had been given names: *Amazing Grace, Smooth Sails Ahead, On Our Way, Homeward Bound,* and *God Speed.* The sailboat names on the sailboat offer some indications of our faith: we hope to be on our way, sailing by grace, with the companionship of God, enjoying both the smooth



sails and the challenges of wind and waves. We don't expect ministry to be easy. But we do claim the beauty of the journey, and that, in the end, it brings each of us Home.

That October Sunday afternoon, I had asked the table groups to answer (in about 8 truly short minutes!) this question: WHO ARE WE AS A CHURCH? On the back of one of the pictures I found one group's answer: seeking to meet needs of church and community by music, by mission, by openness, and prayer. There were five groups answering that question. They didn't have much time to refine an answer, and only one used the back of a sailboat picture to write out their answer, so this is not an official description of who First Presbyterian Church is. Nevertheless, I like being reminded, as these sailboat pictures and this answer to the question remind me, that First Presbyterian Church knows itself to be people who love both worship and mission, and who lean into openness and prayer. Those are good things, important to a faithful and welcoming church.

I took down the pictures. But I lift up the concept we continue to grow into: We are a church, sailing in the power of the Holy Spirit, seeking to move in the direction we feel God sending us, knowing that God is traveling with us.




