We'll enjoy music from our Praise Band as well as songs from children at St. Petersburg Primary School. For the mission project, we'll be assembling care packages of diapers and baby wipes. We will also decorate canvas totes and fill them with children's books (preschool and elementary ages). What a good day to welcome school families, make new church friends, and enjoy fellowship with old friends as well. And eat pancakes! See you there! (Then we get to go upstairs for the 11:00 Sanctuary worship service.) OH, and don't forget to bring diapers, wipes, and children's books (new or gently used) to contribute for the mission project!
- 2. Last week in my sermon I read a wonderful prayer by Thomas Merton. You'll find that prayer below. Keep it: you may use it in your own spiritual journey.
- 3. Are you interested in what I am reading as I try to "go deeper" in my faith? I am reading *Sailboat Church* by Joan Gray and *Horse*, by Geraldine Brooks (okay: not a spiritual book!). A good prayer for all of us by Thomas Merton:

My Lord God, I have no idea where I am going. I do not see the road ahead of me. I cannot know for certain where it will end. Nor do I really know myself, and the fact that I think that I am following your will does not mean that I am actually doing so. But I believe that the desire to please you does in fact please you. And I hope I have that desire in all that I am doing. I hope that I will never do anything apart from that desire. And I know that if I do this you will lead me by the right road, though I may know nothing about it. Therefore will I trust you always, though I may seem to be lost and in the shadow of death. I will not fear, for you are ever with me, and you will never leave me to face my perils alone.

The Session has called our Annual Congregation meeting for the close of the 11:00 Sanctuary service on Sunday February 19. At this meeting, the congregation will hear reports on our ministry in 2022, will elect the 2023 Officer Nominating Committee and our corporate officers for 2023, will be asked to approve Rules of Governance for the church (click HERE to view a copy of that document; paper copies will be available on Sunday mornings). The church has had corporate bylaws for years but has not had a set of ecclesiastical governing rules. This document is an important addition to the church operations manual.


Items needed from members and friends to be sorted and distributed:

- 1. Baby diapers, all sizes plus baby wipe'ems. Sharp-eyed shoppers say you can get good deals on these at Dollar General and Walmart.
- 2. Children's books ONLY. New or gently used books, grades Kindergarten thru 5th Grade.



What we will be doing after slurping down our delicious pancake breakfast?

- 1. For the children's books, we have 45 canvas backpacks to be creatively decorated with stickers and sharpies, then filled with a few books. PLUS, there will be bookmarks to be decorated with messages and drawings.
- 2. The diapers and wipes will be sorted and placed in bags.



What non-profits will be receiving the diapers and wipes and the books and canvas backpacks? Resurrection House, CASA, and COSA (Operation PAR's preschool).

What's our schedule on Sunday, January 29?

9:00 AM: In Fellowship Hall, we'll sit down for a delicious pancake breakfast

brought to us by the Christian Education/Fellowship Committee with help from the Men's Meal Ministry. We'll also be entertained not only by the FPC Praise Band but also by a children's chorus from the day school.

10:00 AM or thereabouts: Children, parents, grandparents and otherwise will begin decorating the backpacks and filling them with books. We'll also be stuffing and sorting for distribution the diapers and wipes.

11:00 AM: We'll move to the Sanctuary for our worship service. Please Note: There will be only one service on January 29th.

Staff Matters Five Questions for Dave Hunt

"I like constructing things, and I also like tearing things down," says Dave Hunt, referencing his earlier career in engineering. "In fact, I'm tearing out my kitchen right now." Dave joined our church staff last September as Coordinator of Pastoral Care. He spent three decades or so in the corporate world before deciding he was hearing God's call for serving others more tangibly, either through non-profit work or church work. "I'm not sure how I sensed this call. There's always been a warm, fuzzy feeling, a comfortable feeling when doing the 'Lord's work,' whether it's building stables, mopping floors, setting up chairs...whatever."

As you know by now, the Personnel and Administration Committee is profiling our staff members on the week of their birthdays. Dave's, however, was a week ago Wednesday, January 18.

"My corporate career took me around the world twice; I lived in Japan for 16 months." Much of his career was with Mazak, the global machine tool manufacturer based in Japan. Back in the day, Dave earned a degree in manufacturing engineering from the University of Cincinnati. He grew up in Cincinnati and was working there with Westwood Presbyterian when he decided to move to Florida two years ago, first to Brooksville and then here to St. Petersburg. "I'm doing no more winters in Ohio." His son



Ben, 28, lives in Chicago and Eddie, 26, lives in Ohio.

We'd like to ask you a few questions, Dave:

Q1: What do you like about your job at First Presbyterian?

Dave: Getting people engaged in the mission of our church takes a lot of energy. I love it. I love meeting those who've been here and those who are new. This is the kind of work I'm being called to, yet it still doesn't completely

fulfill what I sense my call is. I'm still trying to figure that out.

Q2: I understand you like to cook.

Dave: Funny you should ask. I like cooking for 75 to 200 people, but I'm stymied when it comes to cooking at home for a handful of folks.

Q3: Interesting. So what's your favorite food?

Dave: Wow... I don't know. I'll have to get back to you on that. But I haven't missed a meal yet.

Q4: What's your favorite hobby?

Dave: I love woodworking, especially building wood furniture. I built out a 2,000-foot speakeasy room for a county commissioner in Ohio [below]. The smallest things I've done are cutting boards.



Q5: You say work has led you around the world twice. If you could visit one spot in the world today, where would you go?

Dave: I'd go right back to Japan. For one thing I was tall there, but not so much here in the States. More importantly, the Japanese are so friendly and inviting. When I lived there, I became conversant in the language, taking a conversational language course every morning for several hours.


Thank you, Dave, for giving us a peek into your life. Happy belated birthday to you.


