

From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

Dear Friends,

I am writing for the First News that comes out on January 6, which is

EPIPHANY! Some of the world calls it Kings' Day. Epiphany means "revealing." In the lectionary, we have a period of weeks between Christmas and Lent when we look at some of the scriptures that show how Jesus was "revealed" to be the Savior. Scriptures like the star over Bethlehem, the baptism of Jesus, the wedding at Cana where Jesus turned water into wine, Jesus first preaching in Nazareth. People were only beginning to see just who Jesus was.

How was Jesus "revealed" to you? Did you experience Christ as your Savior in a church when the music soared around you and lifted your heart to the spiritual realm? Was it out at sea or on top of a mountain when you saw the incredible power of the earth and its Creator? Was it the day a newborn child was placed in your arms? Was it when your life crashed through health issues or relationship loss or a job that didn't work out, and suddenly you knew you could not face the future without the help of Jesus? However you came to see Jesus as your Savior, I remind you that Jesus will never let you down, that the power of God's revealing is seen in and for you daily. Thanks be to God!

So, how do you respond? Hopefully, you respond in two ways: First: by doubling down in prayer and Bible Study. Turn to the psalms and read them, listen for how they speak to your situation and your heart. Read one of the gospels straight through; make notes about your questions, pray as you read!

Second: find ways to be of use to others. Help the church by volunteering to drive the church van on Sundays or other days, or by assisting with our childcare needs: we could sure use some volunteers to help our paid Sunday morning nursery staff once a month or so. Try delivering Meals on Wheels; you might hear God calling you to that kind of service.

I pray that you find Jesus revealed more and more to you and in you, as you live each day. That's the joy of our faith!


2023 PLEDGES

9:00 a.m. – 11:30 a.m. in the Youth Center


Everyone is welcome – no previous Bible study experience is necessary! This 12-week study will be in 2 parts:


