From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

Dear Friends,

Were you at worship on July 9? Either service? In-person? On-line? If so, you may have seen a couple of wonderful gifts God gave our worshipping community. Here's what happened: The children at worship engaged with us! Because the sermon was about love, the first of the "Fruits of the Spirit," I brought pictures of some things I thought children might love: rainbow, teddy bear, pizza, baby, people hugging. I printed too many pictures. I think I printed eight, when four or five would have been plenty. But anyway.

At the Connect service the children responded: Klaci turned her NO's into YES's. Maxine, Jackson, and Wesley surprised me with hugs. At the Sanctuary service, two small children new to us, 2 or 3 years old, told us pretty clearly about what they love: a DINOSAUR would have been a good picture to add to my collection. And they spontaneously wrapped their arms around one another in a big hug. At both services the "Moment for All Ages" was truly special, heart-warming, dear. The children at worship took me, and maybe all of us, by surprise, capturing our imagination and our hearts. They responded to what I tried to share with them. More than that: God spoke to us through those littles.

God did at least one more thing: after the sermon at 11:00, I offered you a simplistic "Love Bingo" card with a few very simple ideas about ways we show love: giving hugs, sending flowers, calling friends and family, having a will. I

wanted to encourage some interaction on the theme of Love. And it looks like that very simple tool has actually gotten people thinking. One person later told me he needs to make a will. Another has posted the Love Bingo card by their desk. Yet another made a point of calling a loved one on the phone.

It seems that God was present with us on Sunday. Well, yes, I know that God is present with us all the time, every day. But this week I was really touched, humbled, overwhelmed. After all who are we to have God stop by and worship with us? But God was there last Sunday. And it was sweet. Powerful and sweet.

Anyway, I'll see you next week. That's when we'll talk about the second Fruit of the Spirit: JOY! I wonder how God might surprise us then.

Backpacks, Backpacks, and More Backpacks For Our Next Fifth Sunday MissionSunday Our Mission Committee is once again partnering with <u>Live Love St Pete</u>, a non-profit founded by FPC member Melody Proud. Her organization works with local schools to provide much-needed resources to underserved elementary school children in



St. Petersburg. For this month's Fifth Sunday MissionSunday, we will be helping to fill hundreds of backpacks with school supplies, which will be distributed to underprivileged kids the first week of August at the Trop.

This upcoming MissionSunday will be on July 30 in Fellowship Hall. The time available to help will be from 8:00 AM - 1:00 PM. If you attend the 9 o'clock Connect service or the 11 o'clock Sanctuary service, you may help either before or after your service. Melody and other Mission Committee members will be there to assist.

The work is easy-peasy. (*Do kids still say this?*) The backpacks and school supplies have already been purchased through Live Love St Pete's on-going fundraising efforts. So all we need to do is fill them!

Note: if you would like to sponsor a backpack (or more than one!), the cost is \$15 per backpack, and includes all the school supplies we'll be packing in them! You can click HERE to donate online, or you can give a check to the church with "backpacks" in the memo line.







"Our goal is to fill 400 backpacks on MissionSunday," says Melody. "I know that may be aggressive, but it should be easy if we get enough hands to help." She and friends will be filling the other 600 backpacks another time.

And who gets these 1,000 backpacks filled with school supplies? And how will they be distributed? "They will be given to schoolkids K-5 in need of a backpack," Melody says. "And we'll distribute these at the Saturday Morning Shoppe at The Trop's parking lot until they're all gone."

Thank you, Melody, for taking the lead on this worthy effort!


October: Date and topic to be announced soon. Watch this space!

The Art of Ukrainian Eggs

Beautiful, intricately decorated, vibrantly colored eggs are a Ukrainian tradition at Easter, but the custom began long before Christianity came to the region. The name for these eggs, Pysanky, comes from the Ukrainian word pysati, which means to write. The designs are written on the egg, with or without its contents, with hot beeswax using a special tool called a krista. Multiple dips in special dyes, and layers of wax designs, then the removal of all the wax, create the finished egg ready for varnish. The designs include symbols which vary in meaning by creator and region. Original pagan talismans for the return of spring, fertility, and protection from evil evolve to our Christian symbols of peace, new life and resurrection. What appropriate lasting gifts for Easter and throughout the year.
