From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

Dear Friends,

Time is a crazy thing: Here we are in hot humid sultry July and next Tuesday we are celebrating Christmas. Last Sunday at the Sanctuary service, we sang *Joy to the World*! We had to, you see, because we were talking about the second Fruit of the Spirit; JOY. What does it feel like to be singing about and thinking about Christmas in the summer?

One year in Montreat, at the Worship and Music Conference, one of the presenters was from New Zealand. She reminded us that, in her part of the world, Christmas came in their summer. In fact, they would be feeling winter's cold now, during our hot, humid July. In fact, Elena Murray wrote a number of Christmas hymns for her hemisphere: reflecting on the birth of Christ during the hot time of the year, when there was no snow, no bitter cold, no ice. God is beyond time's restraints anyway. God is there in summer and in winter, in spring and in fall. God is there in times of joy and in times of sorrow, in times of peace and in times of struggle. In the church we have a time we call Ordinary Time*. That's the season not known as Advent, Christmastide, Lent, or Eastertime. We may call it Ordinary Time, but none of God's times are Ordinary. All times belong to God, just as we belong to God.

Last Sunday at the Connect service, we had a curious one-year-old, Clayton, who was very interested in the Praise Band and their instruments. He was

eager to try out that drum set. Because he was worrying his mother, and because he was so cute, I scooped him up and held him up to watch as the band played their last song. I was thinking about time, about how this little boy would grow and would choose to be a musician or an artist or a scientist. God will turn this child's times from Ordinary to Extraordinary, as God uses Clayton to make a difference in the world. That's what God has done with you and with me. God has called us, through the times of our lives, to know God's amazing love, and to share that love and grace with the world. I give thanks for that, and for each of you. You have made, and are making, a difference.

Backpacks, Backpacks, and More Backpacks For Our Next Fifth Sunday MissionSunday On July 30, 2023

Our Mission Committee is once again partnering with <u>Live Love St Pete</u>, a nonprofit founded by FPC member Melody Proud. Her organization works with local schools to provide much-needed resources to underserved elementary school children in



St. Petersburg. For this month's Fifth Sunday MissionSunday, we will be helping to fill hundreds of backpacks with school supplies, which will be distributed to underprivileged kids the first week of August at the Trop.

This upcoming MissionSunday will be on July 30 in Fellowship Hall. The time available to help will be from 8:00 AM - 1:00 PM. If you attend the 9 o'clock Connect service or the 11 o'clock Sanctuary service, you may help either before or after your service. Melody and other Mission Committee members will be there to assist.

The work is easy-peasy. (*Do kids still say this?*) The backpacks and school supplies have already been purchased through Live Love St Pete's on-going fundraising efforts. So all we need to do is fill them!

Note: if you would like to sponsor a backpack (or more than one!), the cost is \$15 per backpack, and includes all the school supplies we'll be packing in them! You can click <u>HERE</u> to donate online, or you can give a check to the church with "backpacks" in the memo line.



"Our goal is to fill 400 backpacks on MissionSunday," says Melody. "I know that may be aggressive, but it should be easy if we get enough hands to help." She and friends will be filling the other 600 backpacks another time.

And who gets these 1,000 backpacks filled with school supplies? And how will they be distributed? "They will be given to schoolkids K-5 in need of a backpack," Melody says. "And we'll distribute these at the Saturday Morning Shoppe at The Trop's parking lot until they're all gone."

Thank you, Melody, for taking the lead on this worthy effort!

the third Wednesday of the month from 6 to 8 p.m. in Fellowship Hall. We will fill in more details as they become firm.



Beautiful Flowers, Wonderful History

Sunflowers are the national flower of Ukraine but were actually cultivated by Native Americans in prehistoric North America, then brought to Europe by the Spanish in the 16th century. They became popular in Ukraine in the mid 18th century. Butter was not allowed by the Orthodox Church during Lent, but sunflower oil was. Ukraine is now the

largest producer of seeds and oil in the world.

Each flower head contains many florets. In the center brown or yellow "disk flowers" are arranged in a spiral and mature into the seeds. The outer "petals" are sterile "ray flowers" and are usually yellow. A giant sunflower can produce up to 2000 seeds.

After the Chernobyl nuclear power plant disaster in 1986, Ukrainians planted sunflowers in the devastated area. The flowers not only represented renewal and hope, but they helped extract toxins from the soil. In the summer of 1996, sunflowers were planted by officials at the Pervomaysk missile base in southern Ukraine to mark the removal of nuclear weapons from the country.

A viral video in the invasion's earliest days showed a woman in Henychesk giving seeds to Russian soldiers telling them to put the seeds in their pockets so flowers will grow where they die. Now sunflowers are seen everywhere, a symbol of resistance and hope for Ukraine.
