

Hi FPC Volunteers,


It has been such a joy to have so many of you come greet our students in the morning! Our parents are delighted to see church members on

Meals On Wheels 4 Kids is looking for Volunteers!



Meals On Wheels for Kids (MOW4Kids) is a home-delivered meal program for children who depend on school meals and who are unable to get to school meal distribution sites. This innovative first-of-its-kind program helps children in Hillsborough, Pasco, and Pinellas counties get the food they need. Through this program, volunteers and community partners are helping to reduce childhood hunger (which skyrocketed due to the pandemic) by providing lunchtime meals. MOW4Kids delivers over 5,000 meals each week across Tampa Bay.

By volunteering just a few hours a week, you

can help change lives by ensuring children received nutritious food needed to survive. Volunteer shifts occur morning through midday and include:

- 1. packing food or
- delivering food (driving your own vehicle); a route contains 5-6 stops and takes about 1-2 hours to complete.

You choose the area where you would like to pack or deliver, the day of the week you would like to volunteer (Monday-Friday), and the frequency you would like to help (every week, every other week, once a month).



Volunteer requirements:

- Volunteer application and orientation required to pack or deliver (application can be found online at <u>Volunteer – Tampa Bay Network To</u> <u>End Hunger</u>)
- Pass a level 1 background check (level 2 background check preferred for delivery)
- Be able to stand and/or walk for up to 2 hours and lift and carry up to 30 lbs.


