The New Hope Clinic has been closed since March due to the pandemic. All of Honduras has been locked down and Dr. Davila has not been allowed to travel outside of his home in Tegucigalpa. He sends me reports like the attached every 10 days or so, and they are horrific.



President Orlando Hernandez stole the election 2 years ago. The OAS (Organization of American States) protested, and asked President Trump to intervene. He refused, and since then the president's brother and sister have been indicted and found guilty of narco trafficking in the USA. President Hernandez has been named as well. An already bad situation in Honduras has exploded, as you can read.

Please continue to pray for Honduras and the world as they continue to pray for us.

#### Easy COVID Testing At Tropicana Field

A member of our church writes to share information about a very easy COVID-19 testing experience. She was tested at 9 AM last Friday in the drive-through parking lot on the west side of Tropicana Field. That screening is hosted by BayCare, and the professionals

assisting were very pleasant. From entry to exit it took about 5 minutes. There is no charge.

To receive services you must (a) have symptoms or (b) be referred by a health care provider or (c) possibly have been exposed to COVID-19. The list of symptoms now includes everything from runny nose to backache. No need to dread testing anymore. (Our member tested negative, as expected. Just needed confirmation before minor surgery.)
