Backpacks, Backpacks, and More Backpacks! For MissionSunday, July 30, 2023

Our Mission Committee is once again partnering with <u>Live Love St Pete</u>, a nonprofit founded by FPC member Melody Proud. Her organization works with local schools to provide much-needed resources to underserved elementary school children in



St. Petersburg. This MissionSunday, July 30, we will be helping to fill hundreds

of backpacks with school supplies, which will be distributed to underprivileged kids the first week of August at the Trop.

The time available to help will be from 8:00 AM - 1:00 PM. If you attend the 9 o'clock Connect service or the 11 o'clock Sanctuary service, you may help in Fellowship Hall either before or after your service. Melody and other Mission Committee members will be there to assist. The work is easy-peasy. (*Do kids still say this?*) The backpacks and school supplies have already been purchased through Live Love St Pete's on-going fundraising efforts. So all we need to do is fill them!

Note: *if you would like to sponsor a backpack* (or more than one!), the cost is \$15 per backpack, and includes all the school supplies we'll be packing in

them! You can click <u>HERE</u> to donate online, or you can give a check to the church with "backpacks" in the memo line.



"Our goal is to fill 400 backpacks on MissionSunday," says Melody. "I know that may be aggressive, but it should be easy if we get enough hands to help." She and friends will be filling the other 600 backpacks another time.

And who gets these 1,000 backpacks filled with school supplies? And how will they be distributed? "They will be given to schoolkids K-5 in need of a backpack," Melody says. "And we'll distribute these at the Saturday Morning Shoppe at The Trop's parking lot until they're all gone."


Seeking Church Van Drivers!

Did You Know? The Breadbasket at War

Ukraine's soil is special. Called *chernozem*, it is black, rich in organic humus, and ideal for growing plants. No wonder Ukraine is known as the Breadbasket of Europe, one of the world's largest exporters of corn and wheat. Many nations, especially in North Africa and Western and Central Asia, depend on Ukraine for their food needs.



Then came the Russian invasion, and with it came destruction. Tanks tore up the fields, shells and mines riddled the fields and poisoned the soil, and soldiers stole fuel and equipment. A quarter of the farmland was destroyed. What grain that was produced was stuck until an agreement between Turkey, Russia, and Ukraine opened ports and safe passage through the Black Sea. That deal held for a year, and now it is in question. The war continues to impact the world food supply.

All of us at First Presbyterian are working to stay as connected as possible.
