From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

Dear Friends,

Home sweet home! I am glad to be back from my family vacation in Montreat, NC. I have to say it was nice to be in a place with cool mornings! But it's nice to be home and back here with you at First Pres. Here are some things I thought I might share with you as I return.

- I loved watching the videos of the services you had here. Pastor Jeanie provided wonderful leadership at worship on June 25 and July 2. Thank you, Jeanie!
- Preacher Tony Winter's presence, sermon and prayer on July 25 were really powerful, as he talked about the man whose sight Jesus restored. I noticed that at both services that day, the congregation applauded Rev. Winter. That kind of response is rare but heartfelt. It says to the preacher: "you have spoken to our hearts." Thank you for welcoming Tony, and I am glad we could put that handicap "lift" to use for him in the Sanctuary. Yay!
- On my first Sunday away, I drove down to Mills River, NC to worship with Megan McMillan at her church. Megan is doing well, and her church is wonderful. Megan sent her love to all of you. I wanted to tell you two things about Mills River PC. One: Probably 10 people came up to introduce themselves and welcome me. That was really impressive; it felt

good to be welcomed so personally. Second, and not unconnected: the people at Mills River PC all had on nametags, which was helpful, and the nametags had the first name printed out REALLY BIG. We could do that, and probably should.

• Finally: I love this church. I love the talented, committed people with leadership strengths here at First Presbyterian. But. But. But. We need more of our men to serve as liturgists and communion servers and ushers. Especially with two women ministers serving on staff, you men need to balance us out. Way back when I was young, before women were as visible in leadership, it was always men "up there" doing things. I yearned to see women as readers, as leaders. Now let's be sure to include both men and women in leadership roles. Let's keep the balance: We are all made in God's image: male and female. If you men out there are comfortable with public speaking, and are not yet on our liturgist lists, please let me know (or Amy in the office) and we'll put you on the schedule. Once I heard that the biggest factor in children growing up to attend church was whether the men in their lives attended church. Let's keep that in mind.

Our Mission Committee is once again partnering with <u>Live Love St Pete</u>, a nonprofit founded by FPC member Melody Proud. Her organization works with local schools to provide much-needed resources to underserved elementary school children in



St. Petersburg. For this month's Fifth Sunday MissionSunday, we will be helping to fill hundreds of backpacks with school supplies, which will be distributed to

underprivileged kids the first week of August at the Trop.

This upcoming MissionSunday will be on July 30 in Fellowship Hall. The time available to help will be from 8:00 AM - 11:30 AM. If you attend the 9 o'clock Connect service or the 11 o'clock Sanctuary service, you may help either before or after your service. Melody and other Mission Committee members will be there to assist.

The work is easy-peasy. (*Do kids still say this?*) The backpacks and school supplies have already been purchased through Live Love St Pete's on-going fundraising efforts. So all we need to do is fill them!

Note: if you would like to sponsor a backpack (or more than one!), the cost is \$15 per backpack, and includes all the school supplies we'll be packing in them! You can click <u>HERE</u> to donate online, or you can give a check to the church with "backpacks" in the memo line.



"Our goal is to fill 400 backpacks on MissionSunday," says Melody. "I know that may be aggressive, but it should be easy if we get enough hands to help." She and friends will be filling the other 600 backpacks another time.

And who gets these 1,000 backpacks filled with school supplies? And how will they be distributed? "They will be given to schoolkids K-5 in need of a backpack," Melody says. "And we'll distribute these at the Saturday Morning Shoppe at The Trop's parking lot until they're all gone."

Thank you, Melody, for taking the lead on this worthy effort!

If you might be ready, willing, and able to drive the church van one Sunday a month, please reach out to the Church Office (727-822-2031). We are in need of more drivers. Thanks!


The Little Free Library at FPC has a new landing pad!




Ladies, you are invited to Lisa Harper's new Bible Study! Luke: Gut-Level Compassion
