Dear Friends,

I got surprised by tears on Sunday as we said goodbye to Megan McMillan. One of you said I was not the only one. I have found myself reflecting on how God brings people into our lives for long or short periods of time, and we can learn from them, or teach them, experience things with them, and then suddenly things change. There is sorrow at times about that, or celebration, but in all things, we know that God is at work. God is good. All the time! We have sent Megan off with our love.

I was asked to do the chapel service at Westminster Palms this past Wednesday. The theme for the month's devotionals is "Fun in the Sun." I wasn't sure how to put together a worship time using that theme, but finally decided to use the story of Jonah. Do you remember the story? Jonah prophesied to the evil city of Nineveh that if it didn't change its ways God would destroy it. Jonah then sits up on a hill under the shade of a bush, waiting to see the much-deserved destruction of Nineveh. But Jonah's prophecy was so effective that Nineveh changed its ways and God saved the city. Meanwhile Jonah sat on his hill sulking. But because God has a sense of humor (did you know that?), and God sent a worm to eat away the bush shading Jonah from the hot sun. (There's the connection to Fun in the Sun!) Then God challenges the now angry Jonah: do you care about the bush, but expect me not to care about the great city of Nineveh?

It's fascinating for us to be reminded, at times, as Jonah was on that hot day, that our ways are not God's ways and our thoughts are not God's thoughts. We are always challenged to show more grace and offer more forgiveness than we would when left to our own devices. I am pondering that in my life. Perhaps you will too.


Those who are unable to walk are welcome to come to the parking lot to cheer on the group as we head over to the parade route.

#### AfghanTech Round 2

Last Saturday (June 11), friends and members of First Presbyterian were able to clean and retrofit an additional eight laptops and iPads for our new neighbors from Afghanistan.

Participating in this effort sponsored by our Mission Committee were Don Doddridge, Dimitri Gruszka, Mary and Ronn Johnson, Robin Lyle, Carlen Maddux, Rue Ann Porter, and Susan Schlecht. They were led by our media director, Dave Aumack, and his sailing buddy, IT expert Mike Kelzer.



As with Round 1 in late April, there was considerable downtime as these computers were recycling. "We had a good time talking and catching up with each other," several of the participants acknowledged. Again, it took up to four hours to complete the project Saturday.

A total of 31 members and friends of our church will now have 1) wrapped up and delivered 26 laptops and iPads to these Afghan families resettling here; 2) contributed 24 bike helmets; and 3) offered transportation to their family members as needed.



You may remember, Westminster Communities is working with Lutheran Services to help these Afghan families resettle in St. Petersburg, Bradenton, Orlando and elsewhere in Florida.

Leaving your homeland, family, and friends can be harder than hard. FPC's Mission Committee is grateful to all who contributed their time, effort,


money, and prayers in helping our Afghan friends feel welcomed and accepted in their new home. Thank you.
