## From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

Dear Friends,

Yesterday new member Cameron Blair brought her children, Henry and Liv, age 4 and 5, to the church Youth Center to help us weave a rainbow cover for the Connect communion table. Liv was so ready to name the rainbow colors in order, and each time I needed a new color I would ask her: "Liv, what's the



next one?" "ORANGE!" she would say. And she and Henry held each ribbon at the length mark so I could cut the ribbons the right length. Meanwhile Cameron was weaving ribbons together. Look at how pretty the table is! I was pleased Cameron and I could give Liv and Henry a role to play at the church. Because of that morning helping us and playing in the Youth Center space while we worked, they will know about the communion table, and about being important to the church. They helped do something interesting, significant, and fun. I loved Liv's hugs as she responded to this experience! I was also pleased to set up a visually beautiful piece of our worship for Pride month. We will focus on unity in worship this month: lifting up how important each and all of God's children are, how much God loves each one. After all, we are all ONE when we recognize and appreciate each other, like the woven ribbons on the communion table, each color contributing to the whole. As we dedicate our Honduras Mission team this Sunday, we acknowledge the one-ness we experience with other parts of the world. Like the deacons we will install on June 11: each one brings their own energy, intelligence, imagination, and love to the whole of the deacons' work.

Where are you in the tapestry of God's people? What color or texture do you bring? How are you stronger and brighter because you are part of the whole? We are one, after all, just as Jesus prayed we would be in John 17:20-21: *I ask not only on behalf of these, but also on behalf of those who will, believe in me through their word, that they may all be one.*

refreshments as we create a space of warmth and acceptance. All are welcome, including those who have been hurt by previous church experiences.


#### Meeting with the Pastor During Pride Month
