From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

Dear Friends,

One thing I missed because of COVID (boo, COVID!) was the chance to stand up at the Annual Congregational meeting to be sure you heard this awesome news: IN 2023 WE ENDED THE BUDGET YEAR IN THE BLACK!!! There was to be a pause for this information to sink in, and then: *Applause!!! Cheers!!! Jubilation!!!*

One thing I have learned through my ministry is that there are a number of indicators of the overall health of a church. Good attendance is one indicator. Responsiveness at worship is another. I love to hear good singing, laughter at light moments, feedback related to ideas shared....and financial reports give yet another indication of the church's health. The reality is that I am seeing strong indicators of health here at First Presbyterian: strong attendance, new people participating in ministries, laughter and joy at worship.

These things work together to support a thriving ministry, which is what you have here at First Presbyterian Church. **Congratulations! Good work!**

I guess the wind continues blowing, the Holy Spirit keeping this seaworthy craft moving in ready and growing ministry. I stand back, sometimes, in awe at what God seems to be doing here. Thank you for being on this voyage with me, with us, together. God be praised!

The story of a young black girl who prays for her eyes to turn blue; so that she will be beautiful, so that people will




look at her, and so that her world will be different. First published in 1970, recently banned in FL public schools. Susan Luehrs will lead our discussion.

MARCH 20: The Dynamic History of St. Petersburg's Marine Science Complex by Peter R. Betzer, PhD,

Founding Dean Emeritus of the College of Marine Science at USF. Dr. Betzer will talk to us about what propelled him to create the marine science program, why it was needed then, and why it is important today to have this academic program in our own back yard.

<u>APRIL 17</u>: *From Folk Medicines to Therapeutic Drugs by Akiko Tanaka PhD, president, and co-founder of The Tampa Bay Research Institute (TBRI)*. TBRI has spent over 40 years investigating the relationship between viruses, cancers, and the functioning of the immune system. As a result of our research, TBRI has uncovered the details of the healing properties of an ancient folk medicine – an extract of pinecones. Our on-going studies have now brought forth new synthetic molecules that are being developed into lifesaving immune-altering therapeutics.

Beach Drive Forums are monthly conversations for the community with intriguing speakers on thought-provoking topics. Wednesdays from 5:30-7:30 PM in Fellowship Hall (doors open at 5:30, presentation at 6:00). Refreshments and Q&A included. Open to the public; best parking is the church lot off N. Shore Drive.

College Scholarships - Apply Now!

We are now accepting applications for college scholarships! These scholarships include the Ohrns Scholarship for undergraduates and the Osborn Scholarship for Theology students. We only require one application is for both Fall 2024 and Spring 2025 semesters (awards are split); the applicant needs to let us know if they only need it for one semester. The deadline for Undergraduate/Graduate Scholarships is March 10; The deadline for Theological Study Scholarships is April 30.

- 1. a completed application form;
- 2. a copy of your most recent high school or college transcript;
- 3. a 500-word essay describing your involvement in church-related activities as well as extra-curricular and community involvement activities, why you want this grant, and what you expect to do following the completion of your education.

The Scholarship Committee will review the applications and the Session will approve the final awards. Successful applicants will be asked to provide proof of enrollment and acceptance by their educational institution. Funds for the scholarship will be sent directly to the institution so be sure to give the proper name and address to which the funds are to be sent. Questions?
