### GUEST MUSICIAN THIS SUNDAY: Sarah Shellman, violin

Sarah Shellman is currently principal second violin with The Florida Orchestra; she joined the ensemble as a section violinist in 2002. She last appeared as a soloist on the TFO Masterworks

series in March 2011, performing Thomas Ades' Violin Concerto *Concentric Paths*. She's also been featured on the Coffee series programs performing *Winter* and *Spring* from Vivaldi's *The Four Seasons* and Bach's *Concerto for Two Violins in D minor* with Nancy Chang. She is an advocate for the performance of works by living composers as well as for the expansion of diversity, equity, and inclusion initiatives within the classical music profession. Shellman graduated from the Oberlin Conservatory of Music in 1998 with a bachelor's degree in music and the University of Houston in 2000 with a master's degree in music. While living in Houston, she played with the Houston Grand Opera, Houston Ballet, and as a freelance musician. In addition to her work on the modern violin, she has also performed with several early music ensembles as a violinist, violist, and mezzo-soprano.

### From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

Dear Friends,

I have enjoyed being out on sailboats a time or two, but I have not been a sailor. I thought you might enjoy this crazy story.

My family lived in Jacksonville, on the St. Johns River, a few "yards" away from the local YMCA. After my first year of college, I brought three college friends home with me from Atlanta: Julie, Carolyn, and Nancy. I wanted to show them all the adventures of my life in Jacksonville. We did lots of fun things that week, like sleep one night out on the dock. You know, fun things like that. One day we checked out one of the sailboats at the YMCA to go for a sail. They gave us a 10-minute course in sailing and away we went. It did not take long for us to be in big trouble, going nowhere but into the weeds alongside the riverbank. Big in my memory is the moment when our petite, Alabama farm-girl friend Julie, turned to tall, strong Tennessean and said, "Carolyn, you need to get out and pull." Without any debate, Carolyn was over the side into the water, dragging our sailboat to the nearest dock. I guess the Y may have sent someone to get the boat while we walked back on land to my house. It might have been Carolyn's idea to try sailing. Even that was a great adventure for 19-year-old college students.

Being a sailboat church will take some learning, some practice, some partnership. We will not get it right at the beginning. I am sure it would take more than a 10-minute crash course in sailboat churching. That's why we are reading the book, offering class discussions, working on the 40 days of prayer. In fact, we have arranged for Joan Gray to come meet with us for our church retreat at Cedarkirk at the end of April. It will be our opportunity to share our thoughts and questions with her, on the church guided and powered by the Holy Spirit and prayer. I hope you are enjoying the journey!


### Using Your IRA to Fund Your Pledge

The IRS requires annual withdrawals from a traditional Individual Retirement Account for everyone 73 or older. These withdrawals are known as Required Minimum

Distributions or RMDs. Since IRAs are funded with pretax dollars, the government implemented RMDs to generate income tax from the IRA. Failure to meet the required amount could result in a penalty of 50% of the required amount!

One way to satisfy both the RMD and support the church financially is with a Qualified Charitable Distribution or QCD. A QCD is a direct transfer of funds from a traditional Individual Retirement Account (IRA) to a qualified charity, such as FPC St Petersburg. QCDs can be counted toward satisfying required minimum distributions (RMDs) for the year if certain rules are met. The money is a direct transfer that never passes through the hands of the IRA holder. Instead, the IRA custodian can either send a check directly to the charity or the account owner, who then hands it over to the charity. This allows the donor to avoid paying taxes on the amount withdrawn and potentially stay in a lower income tax bracket. A QCD reduces your Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) which may reduce your overall taxes. In most cases, a QCD is the MOST tax-efficient way to support a qualified charity, like FPC St. Petersburg.

- 1. a completed application form;
- 2. a copy of your most recent high school or college transcript;
- 3. a 500-word essay describing your involvement in church-related activities as well as extra-curricular and community involvement activities, why you want this grant, and what you expect to do following the completion of your education.

The Scholarship Committee will review the applications and the Session will approve the final awards. Successful applicants will be asked to provide proof of enrollment and acceptance by their educational institution. Funds for the scholarship will be sent directly to the institution so be sure to give the proper name and address to which the funds are to be sent. Questions? 
# Easter Eggstravaganza is coming...Please help us prepare!
