From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

Dear Friends,

Last week, I participated in the Leadership in Ministry (LIM) Conference I attend twice each year. As a result of conversations in my LIM coaching group, I am rethinking a key part of my childhood. I have told you that I was the "wild child" in my family, often angry and frustrated. Why was that? It was because I was the second of the five children and I did not get my way as often as I thought appropriate. You might understand how that could be.

The way I have understood those years was that nobody liked me very much (including myself, if I am honest). Nobody, that is, except Grandmother Merrin. My coaching group suggested that there was something in Grandmother and in me that met need each of us had, and that we were good for each other. In fact, the group suggested, Grandmother's house provided a safe place for me to grow into myself. I always wished she lived nearer; I only got to be with her two or three times each year. I treasured those times.

I tell you this story as a way to say that sometimes we can find ourselves understanding our lives and our faith in new ways, even though nothing about the "facts" has changed. We might see the hopes and needs and even the talents of our lives with new eyes. We might see how God provided resources that we never realized were there for us. In fact, looking back, we might realize that God was actually there all the time, even when we were sad or afraid or lonely.

If that could be true of our past, how much more true it can be of our present and our future, as God shines a light into our hearts, or comes with a new insight or a new gift of love and hope.

This coming Sunday, I will be looking at this idea as we turn to Jeremiah 31:31-34, the New Covenant. We get to look at how God reached out to the people of Israel in new ways, and we can consider how God reaches out to us in new ways too. Loving us, wanting the best for humankind, God has never given up on us, and never will give up on us. That's the gift of *love*. That's the gift of *forgiveness*. That's the gift of *hope*.

We are on this great journey toward Easter, the amazing day of *love, forgiveness, and hope*. The day of *new life*! Watch for it. Be ready for it!






New Member Inquirer's Class THIS Sunday, March 17, 10 AM, in the Church Office Conference Room

<u>APRIL 17</u>: *From Folk Medicines to Therapeutic Drugs by Akiko Tanaka PhD, president, and co-founder of The Tampa Bay Research Institute (TBRI)*. TBRI has spent over 40 years investigating the relationship between viruses, cancers, and the functioning of the immune system. As a result of our research, TBRI has uncovered the details of the healing properties of an ancient folk medicine – an extract of pinecones. Our on-going studies have now brought forth new synthetic molecules that are being developed into lifesaving immune-altering therapeutics.

Beach Drive Forums are monthly conversations for the community with intriguing speakers on thought-provoking topics. Maundy Thursday: Commemorating the Last Supper


Thursday, March 28, 5:30 PM
