
## Midweek Family Fun: Italian Dinner and Game Night Wednesday March 22, 2023



## Our Next Mission Sunday - April 23 For the Honduras Clinic

Thank you, thank you, thank you that our Mission Sundays have been such overwhelming successes! Our members and friends have donated many, many items as well as their time, effort and money.

Our next effort will be sorting and sending health kits to the Honduras Clinic when a group of 15 from FPC and other churches will be traveling there in June. Our next Mission Sunday will be on April 23, the fourth Sunday in April rather than the traditional fifth. That's because April 30 will be our time in Cedarkirk and the annual St. Anthony's run will be circling our church grounds. (There will be ONLY ONE service on April 30 at 11 am).

We will be sending 1,000 adult health kits and 1,000 child kits. Items to buy and bring for these health kits:

- Toothbrushes, adult and children.
- Dental floss.
- Band-Aids.
- Wash cloths.
- 1-Quart Ziplock bags AND 1-Gallon Ziplock bags. NOTE: Please do NOT fill the Ziplock bags.

So why do we need as many hands as possible during this Mission Sunday work session? "We'll have three workstations," says Susan Schlecht who's been going to Honduras for years. "We'll be able to sit around our circle tables and talk and catch up with each other while we're doing these tasks."

Workstation #1...We'll make cardboard picture frames for the Honduran

children and put them in Ziplock bags. These are made from punchout cardboard sheets that Susan and her crew will provide. No tools are needed other than your fingers and thumb. <u>These children don't have school take-home pictures. These may be the only ones they'll have of themselves</u>. *Psst...* Don't tell anyone, but any of our children helping with this can take some home with them.



**Workstation #2...**Sheets of stickers, also provided, will need to be cut and put in the bags for the Honduran children. Scissors will be provided. And any of our kids helping can take some of these home as well.

**Workstation #3**...This will be our deconstruction table. We'll remove toothbrushes, dental floss, Band-Aids, and wash clothes from their packaging before putting into Ziplock bags. "We're doing this so we can recycle the packaging here," says Susan. "If we waited to do this in Honduras, the packaging would just add to the litter that's already there. They don't have recycling facilities."

Now...If you would like to contribute but are unable to attend our packing sessions or to bring any items, <u>please think about</u> <u>contributing money to help purchase 20</u> <u>soccer balls and 25 jump ropes for kids</u>. Soccer balls run about \$20 apiece and



jump ropes about \$15 each. Just make a check out to First Presbyterian and note that it's for the Honduras Clinic, for soccer balls or for jump ropes.

On April 23, there will be several work shifts to choose from. We will still have our two worship services at 9:00 and 11:00. The work will be in Fellowship Hall.

- If you're going to the 9 AM service, we are open at 8 AM, so you can come before the service OR you can come after the service.
- If you're going to the 11 AM service, you can come at any point up to 11:00.

Please note that someone from the Mission Committee will be available to direct and help from 8-11 AM. Easy-peasy.

ALSO NOTE: If you're unable to bring items on April 23, but can bring them earlier, we'll have Honduras-designated baskets available starting this Sunday, March 19, at both services in which you can drop off your items.

This is a very giving church. Thank you again for your time, effort, prayers, and financial contributions.

### Staff Matters Five Questions for Amy McCutcheon

Educated as a school teacher and psychologist. Licensed real estate and in property/casualty insurance. Service to others. House renovator. World traveler.

These are the many aspects and aspirations of Amy McCutcheon's life, our Church Office Administrator since March 2019. The Personnel and Administrative Committee is profiling Amy because today, March 17, is Amy's birthday. And it's St. Patrick's Day...Top o' the morning to you, Amy!



Amy was born in Houston, Texas, but grew up in rural Virginia along the Chesapeake Bay. "I am an only child...spoiled but not rotten!" She graduated from William and Mary with the double major of Elementary Education and Psychology. "Training in elementary education has been invaluable in the business world and church work. I probably shouldn't explain why."

Following college, she joined the same insurance company where her father

worked in Richmond, VA, "but in a different division." Amy moved to St. Petersburg in 2004 "without knowing a soul. I came because of the weather." And weather she got. "That was the year seven hurricanes criss-crossed Florida. I thought 'What have I done?" She found a job working as an administrator in the marine division of an insurance agency, although "I've got to admit, insurance was never an aspiration of mine."

While she was attending First Baptist Church on Gandy Blvd., one of the pastors needed a full-time assistant. "Hmmm," she thought. "I think I can do that." So she applied and got the job. That was her first foray into staff work with a church. After about seven years there, she left to take a similar position with the Missions Pastor at another Baptist church, South Tampa Fellowship. After two years there, she returned to First Baptist. She was there for another five years, and decided she would try real estate as an administrative assistant,

though she only spent about a year in that position. "The woman I worked for was a delightful human being, but the 24/7 aspect of real estate was not for me."

We have some questions for you, Amy:

Q1: Why did you get into church administrative work? Amy: Serving others is very much at my core. I find this a good way to combine my aspirations and my skills. The dynamic of church work incorporates who I am with being on a mission.

Q2: What brought you to First Presbyterian?

Amy: As I felt that my time in real estate was drawing to a close, I went online

to see what was "out there," and I saw First Presbyterian's posting. I noticed on the church website that Linda Champion was the Staff Accountant. Linda and I had worked together for several years at First Baptist, so I called to get her take. After we talked, I sent her my resume, which she passed along to Pastor Conti. So here I am!

Q3. You married not long ago, right? Amy: Yes, Mead and I married in November 2021. He's a machinist. At his last job, he actually got to make some of the parts that helped to land the Mars Rover. Guess you could say his fingerprints are on Mars! Thankfully he was able to change jobs this past year so we are able to spend more time together.



#### Q4: What are your hobbies?

**Amy:** Well, right now, all of our spare time is spent renovating/updating the house we bought in Largo back in January (our first house together!). However, before husband and house, I loved to travel. I've been to 18 countries (so far); mostly in Europe, Central and South America, and the Caribbean. My most memorable and life-changing trip was the 3 months I served as a short-term missionary onboard the Mercy Ship *Anastasis* (Greek for resurrection).

#### Q5: Do you attend a local church?

**Amy:** Yes, Radiant Church, which is where I met my husband. It's nondenominational, with eight campuses around Tampa Bay.

## College Scholarships - Apply Soon!



- 2. a copy of your most recent high school or college transcript;
- 3. a 500-word essay describing your involvement in church-related activities as well as extra-curricular and community involvement activities, why you want this grant, and what you expect to do following the completion of your education.

The Scholarship Committee will review the applications and the Session will

approve the final awards. Successful applicants will be asked to provide proof of enrollment and acceptance by their educational institution.
