
New Power Hour Sunday School Session beginning March 27

God is often at work through the ordinary: ordinary people, ordinary objects, ordinary grace. Through the ordinary, God communicates epiphanies, salvation, revelation, and reconciliation. It is through the mundane that we hear God's quiet voice. The book, *Lent in Plain Sight*, draws our attention to ten ordinary objects that Jesus would have encountered on his way to Jerusalem.

We will use the season of Lent to facilitate conversation and connection to each other and the meaning of this time in the church year. The goal of this lunch and fellowship time will be to focus on spiritual lessons and recognize how the seemingly ordinary can reveal the extraordinary presence of God in our lives. Update from Dr. Davila, New Hope Clinic, Honduras March 7, 2022

Greetings and Blessings,

This week the government reports 413,699 COVID infections and 10,785

deaths as a result of contacting COVID. Infections and deaths continue daily although hospitalizations and COVID intensive care have diminished.



At the clinic we continue to diagnose and treat COVID patients since there is a high percentage of the population that don't use a mask and the means of prevention are minimal; the serious cases have gone down. I thank the Lord first and then for the vaccination campaigns that are in Honduras almost obligatory.

In the clinic all the staff have contacted COVID. Thanks to the Lord I am the only one who has not yet been infected. I believe that is because I always try to employ biosecurity means, I avoid compromising social situations, I double mask and I have had the two shots and a booster. The Lord has been good to me and to my family.

The Secretary of Health has finally given us the health certificate valid until Dec. 2027.

Many people in the communities ask me with great joy and hope about the missionaries and the health fairs but they understand the situation and that their absence is due to the pandemic. The people are praying for you all and for the daily benefit the clinic brings them with its many attentions and services.
