From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

Dear Friends,

As we come to Holy Week and Easter, we find ourselves impatient for the joy of Easter, as we ponder the difficult path Jesus had to walk that week: facing opposition, betrayal, arrest, and trial. He was whipped and mocked, and made to carry his own cross up the hill, where, as a common criminal, he was nailed to this Roman cross and hung to die in the hot sun. Good Friday never seems so "good," does it? with Jesus hanging three hours on a cross, his dead body placed in a borrowed tomb. We are eager to move past all this sorrow. Ready to move on to Easter, to have the joy of Easter baskets and Easter eggs, of bright new clothes, and wonderful upbeat hymns and anthems. But we can't get to Easter without first getting through Good Friday. Jesus had to die in order to be resurrected. He had to pay for our sins in order to save us from the powers of evil and death. It is his death that leads to new life, his and ours.

There's a story that fits this journey of death leading to life. A church had an oak tree that was planted in memory of a dearly loved member, but the tree lost all its leaves and died. Members of the family could not bear that the tree planted in memory of their loved one had died, so they bought another tree to plant in its place. They decided to do the removal and replanting at night, so the rest of the church would never know the first tree had died. All their plans went well until the family arrived in the church yard that evening with the new tree. Bringing out their shovels to remove the dead tree, they saw clusters of new green leaves on the "dead" tree. The tree was not dead. It was waiting...waiting for the proper time to blossom with new growth.

I told this story once at a Moment for All Ages. Then I asked "What do you think of that?" I was shocked and thrilled when one of the children simply said: "It's resurrection." A seven-year-old boy - he got it! He knew about Jesus and the empty tomb, about new life, about resurrection. The church had done its job, sharing the truth of the gospel with that child.

We should all know about new life, about resurrection, about how in God's grace death can lead to new life, despair can lead to hope, sorrow can give way to joy. That's resurrection. That's Holy Week and Easter. That's faith in Jesus Christ, the Son of God, our Lord. Thanks be to God!

See you at church these coming days as we journey through Holy Week to the cross and the empty tomb.
