From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

Dear First Folks:

Last year I was working daily out in my garden. I removed old struggling shrubs and set out bushes that were classified as Florida natives. These new plants were supposed to manage well in our soil and weather, and they would provide for birds, bugs, and butterflies. Doing that work in the garden was a joy, and Harry and I loved seeing many happy birds and butterflies, counting the caterpillars, and watching new bright butterflies emerge from cocoons.

This year I don't have as much time for the garden. I'm glad for the plants that are continuing to do well on their own. I admit that they don't ALL look so

good. There was a Black-Eyed Susan I had enjoyed. Some of it was blooming well this year, but a chunk of it was dead, dead, dead. One morning I got energetic and pulled out the dead part of the plant. Guess what? The vibrant blooming part was on that same stem - I had just pulled it up! What a disappointment.

I should have been more like Jesus and pruned the plant, cutting away the dead parts but nurturing the living stems. I would do that at the church, wouldn't I? Wouldn't I? Watching for the signs of life and nurturing them.... Letting the old parts, the parts no longer needed.... Letting them go.... How does that work? It is probably a good metaphor for us to ponder, as we move on in ministry through Lent and toward Holy Week. Where will God bring us new life in our church and in our own faith? Where will God challenge us to prune? Where will God bring us to bloom, to grow, to flourish in life and ministry? Something to think about! Something to work on.


Easter Lilies




An Update on the FPC Little Free Library
