

Barracoon, The Story of the Last Black Cargo by Zora Neal Hurston, is the Faith & Fiction read for next




month. Our discussion of this book will be on **March 7th**, at **7:00 p.m.** in Room N-123. Debbie Factor will be our Discussion Leader.


