

Day of Pentecost

Scripture: Ezekiel 37:1-14, Psalm 104:24-34, 35b, Acts 2:1-21



The Day of Pentecost is this Sunday. Pentecost, 50 days after Easter, marks the ending of the season of Easter and celebrates the birthday of the Church when God's Spirit was poured out in Jerusalem. On that day, Acts 2 tells us that there were tongues of fire and loud rushing winds. Language barriers that divided God's people from one other were removed. The disciple, Peter, got up and preached the sermon of his life and 3,000 were baptized that day.

A very unique Pentecost worship service has been planned by your FPC worship team for Pentecost 2021. Although the Good News is traditionally proclaimed through a sermon, other acceptable Presbyterian forms of proclamation include song, drama, dance, and testimony. This Sunday, the Good News of Pentecost will be proclaimed through a reader's theatre interspersed with music, visual art, and dance. Come see the sculpture of flames that has been created just for this day that sits in front of the communion table. Come welcome the Holy Spirit with red streamers. Come bring your children and grandchildren for a very special time with the younger disciples. Come join in prayer for an outpouring of God's Spirit for this time and place! Oh, and by the way, don't forget to wear RED!

The Return to Church Committee met this week and revisited the church's mask policy in light of the recent changes to the CDC's guidelines.

We rejoice over the CDC's new guidelines and at what they mean for us all — that vaccines work, that vaccinated people are able to do more safely, and that the end of this pandemic is in sight. We thank God for this good news, for the hope and relief that it brings, for the intellectual gifts God gave scientists over the ages to get us to this point, and for the selfless sharing of those gifts with the rest of us! We also note that the CDC still requires masks in hospitals, in care facilities, on public transportation, and for those who are not vaccinated. We're aware that children under 12 years of age still aren't able to be vaccinated, and that some in our community have not yet had a chance to be vaccinated.

Jesus constantly aligned himself with the most vulnerable—widows, women, children, the blind, the sick, the outcast, and the poor. Therefore, we will follow Jesus' lead by loving all of our neighbors, especially the most vulnerable among us, by wearing masks at church until health officials tell us it is safe for all people to unmask. May God bless you all and keep you safe and healthy.

No Congregational Meeting This Sunday (May 23)

A congregational meeting was announced last week, originally scheduled for this coming Sunday, May 23. Please note that upon further reflection, the session has rescinded the action taken at the May 6 called session meeting to call a congregational meeting for today immediately following worship. The purpose of this meeting was to hear the report of the Nominating Committee and to approve the election of Paul Culley and Rick Robertson to serve on the session. This meeting has been postponed until after the result of the vote taken at the June 6th congregational meeting (please see below) has been tallied and reported.

The session has called a congregational meeting for 1:00 p.m. on Sunday, June 6, 2021, in response to a request from at least one-fourth of the active membership of the congregation for the purpose of deciding whether to dissolve the pastoral relationship between the church and the Rev. Dr. Dawn Conti. This Presbytery has appointed Rev. Dr. John DeBoise to moderate this meeting. The meeting will include both onsite and online opportunities for those on the active members' role to attend and participate. Voting will be limited only to active members who attend the meeting onsite or online, just as it is in any meeting. Additional details about how to attend, participate, and vote will be provided before the meeting.
