

From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

Dear Friends,

First Presbyterian Church of St. Petersburg welcomes and affirms the gifts of all people.

The Session approved the statement above at its May meeting. It is an affirmation for us to ponder and to declare, every Sunday and every day.

I remember stories of how the American church struggled with integration, especially in the South, back in the 50's and 60's. One story I remember was when the Session of a "white church," after long and serious debate, voted that African Americans were welcome to worship at their church "as long as there was room." When that was announced at worship the next Sunday, one of the beloved older members stood as said, *Well, if there isn't room, they can have my seat.*

I imagine that dear, courageous, outspoken woman looking around that sanctuary, catching the eyes of people who respected and loved her. If she would give up her seat, others would give up theirs as well. All would be made welcome in that church. It was a hard time, a time of change, but that Christ follower made it plain: all were welcome.

The welcome we offer at church, the way we include people, not just in worship, but in all our events and in leadership roles, that is not our welcome to extend, but God's. In the sight of God all are welcome. All are called. I don't know that any of us disagree about this, but it is still important to declare. Not one of us deserves a particular place. We are in the church, and even in the world, by God's invitation. So it is important for us to welcome all, just as the Session has said. To welcome and affirm their gifts, their needs, their place. *This church welcomes and affirms the gifts of all people.* Whatever color, whatever language, whether young or old, gay or straight,

whatever educational level, whatever financial status... all are welcome here. I hope we can all reach out to others and show that this is true.

Every Sunday in June, experience uplifting worship services filled with relevant sermons and special musical guests. Together, we will explore meaningful ways to embrace our diverse




