IN-PERSON WORSHIP IN THE SANCTUARY SUNDAYS AT 10 AM!

We are asking you to make a reservation every week to attend in-person worship services. There are two ways to register:

1) Go online! Every Monday morning, you will receive an email with a link to click to RSVP for the upcoming Sunday. You will also find the RSVP button on the main page of our website. Please remember to complete ALL boxes, then click the "Submit" button at the bottom. We will take reservations for Sunday until noon on Friday.

OR

(2) Call the Church Office (727-822-2031) before Friday at noon.

If you plan to attend in-person on Sundays, PLEASE NOTE:

• If you have had a fever, cough, above normal temperature, runny nose, sore throat, shortness of breath, reduction of sense of smell, or have been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 in the past 14 days, we ask that you stay home and watch the service

online.

- Masks will be required.
- Seating will be limited to ensure social distancing.
- For your safety, prior to service, you will check in at the front doors, and be seated by ushers at a safe social distance.
- Hand sanitizer will be available in several easy-to-access spots.
- Our elevator will NOT be accessible.
- The Sanctuary will have **one entrance** and **one exit** only. Signs will point you in the right direction.
- We ask that you do not congregate in the Sanctuary at all after the service. If you wish to stop and visit with friends, please make your way out of the Sanctuary first and visit outside.

Thank you in advance for your patience with these safety procedures. We look forward to seeing you in-person on Sunday morning!


Introducing a New (Paperless!) Way to Access Our Sunday Morning Worship Service Bulletin!

Starting this Sunday (May 9), you will see the below **QR code** posted in various spots at the back of the Sanctuary. If you have a "smart phone," you will be able to use this code to access an online copy of the order of service!

- 1. Go to the camera feature of your phone (like you are about to take a picture).
- 2. Aim the camera at the QR code.
- 3. A pop-up will appear on your phone (it may take a minute!).
- 4. Click that pop-up. It will take you to a screen (looks like the picture below) with a link to this Sunday's order of worship.

The basic form of ministry is the ministry of the whole people of God... to fulfill particular functions. Members and those in ordered ministries serve together under the mandate of Christ. (G-2.0101)

As stated in our polity, it's not just those in ordered ministry (Teaching and Ruling Elders) that are called to serve the church. We are looking for members and friends who are willing and able to serve the whole people of God during our worship services as a Liturgists.
