our ample grass parking area south of the sanctuary, or in the circle drive in front.


Our church will be assisting RunFest in the following ways:


FPC Concert Series: *The Sounds of Glory* Sunday, November 14, 2021 at 7:00 PM


However, the best part of Thanksgiving was getting a big spoon and scooping out the dressing from the cold turkey.
