A Note from Interim Pastor, Ginny Simmons Ellis

First Friends,

Last week we took some really important steps. On Friday (Nov. 12), the Session met (with the Presbytery Administrative Commission) and approved some "open-up" steps. The church is now in mask-optional status for those who have been fully vaccinated: in the offices, and classrooms, for worship, for singing, and for outside events or groups using our spaces. For those not yet fully vaccinated, we recommended that masks be worn.

We will also be reinstating a Moment for All Ages (which we sometimes refer to as a Children's Sermon), and a non-touch Passing of the Peace. This coming Sunday we'll teach everyone the sign language for the Passing of the Peace. No hugs yet, folks, no walking around the room, but we can say it: "The Peace of Christ be with you!"

The other big step was, as you know, that last Sunday afternoon, the congregation elected 7 new elders. These men and women will be installed in December after their time of study and preparation. It is a good group of church leaders and a wonderful moment of us in our ministry together. First Church has had a hard year or two; it is now time to breathe a sigh of relief and listen for how God will answer our sighs and call us forward in ministry and in mission.

Please continue to pray for the church, for its staff and leaders, and for the world as we seek to get past the Coronavirus and so many other issues.

Have a wonderful Thanksgiving and please let us know if there is any way we can lend a hand or listen to a need.



Do you feel weighed down with worry?


Does the uncertainty and chaos of life keep you up at night?




Grieving? Know someone who is?
