
Attend In-Person Worship In The Sanctuary

If you attend in person, please remember:

You will need to reserve a spot to attend. There are two ways to register:

- (1) Go online! An email will be sent to you each Monday morning with a link to click to RSVP for the upcoming Sunday. You will also find a RSVP button on the main page of our website, or you can go directly to fpcstpete.com/rsvpforsunday. Please complete ALL boxes, then click "Submit to RSVP" OR
- (2) Call the Church Office (727-822-2031) Monday through Friday between 9 a.m. and noon. You will be asked a series of questions; some will be health-related. All information collected will be kept confidential. No reservations will be accepted after Friday at noon, and voicemail messages are not RSVPs. If you can help answer phones in the mornings on Tuesdays, please let Amy know!
 - Remember: You will be required to wear a mask. If you forget one, we will have extras available.
 - Hand sanitizer will be available in several easy-to-access spots for your safety.
 - Please note that the elevator will NOT be accessible.
 - The sanctuary will have **one entrance** and **one exit** <u>only</u>. Signs will point you in the right direction.
 - For your safety, prior to service, you will check in at the front doors, and be seated by ushers at a safe social distance.
 - We ask that you do not congregate in the sanctuary at all after the service. If you wish to stop and visit with friends, make your way out of the sanctuary first and visit outside. We want you to spend as little time inside the sanctuary as possible.

Thank you in advance for your patience with these new procedures. We look forward to returning to in-person worship while maintaining the safest environment possible!

Congregational Meeting Notice

A called congregational meeting will be held this Sunday, November 22 at 12:30 p.m. online (via Zoom). The purpose of the meeting will be to approve the use of electronic



meetings, hear the recommendation of the Associate Pastor Nominating Committee, and approve a call for an Associate Pastor for FPC-St. Petersburg.

Details about the candidate, including a pre-recorded message from the candidate, will be shared at the meeting. A comprehensive written call package will be sent out via Constant Contact to friends and members of the church after the meeting, and questions will be fielded by the members of

the Nominating Committee as well as the Rev. Bobby Musengwa, First Presbyterian Church's liaison to the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry.

Active and affiliate members of the church are invited to join this online congregational meeting. The Book of Order stipulates that active members have voice and vote while affiliate members have voice only in congregational meetings. All others are invited to watch the meeting on the FPC-St. Petersburg YouTube channel or Facebook page. If you are not able to join us on Sunday at 12:30, a recording of the meeting will be available.

A big thank you to those who registered for the in-person congregational meeting following 10 a.m. worship this coming Sunday, as well as to those who helped register them. As there were not enough active members registered to constitute a quorum, the congregational meeting was moved to the online venue. 

News From Dr. Davila and New Hope Clinic

Many people have been asking about Dr. Davila and the Honduras New Hope Clinic after first Hurricane Eta and now Hurricane Iota have slammed Central America in the past two weeks. Here is his communication from Nov. 18, 2020:



Hurricane Iota has left the Honduras territory but we continue to receive rain from the atmospheric phenomenon. The weather forecast for today and tomorrow is continued rain. The damage from the hurricanes have been principally on the Atlantic coast of Honduras, the same zone that was destroyed a few days ago by Hurricane Eta. The rest of the country has only suffered from intense rains without major human loss, but of course loss of property, primarily in the agricultural and farming regions. The rains are forecast with less intensity but we hope the next few days will improve the conditions.

I was able to travel to Orica last week to the clinic and stay till Friday afternoon. The roads were in bad condition after Eta, but still possible. I am in Tegucigalpa now [his home]. In Orica, after hurricane Iota this week, all is well except that the river fords are affected. For the moment Orica and the Clinic are isolated. After the rains they will begin repairs and I believe next week the bridges will be repaired and we can get back to the clinic.

Thank you so much for all your prayers for Honduras. The truth is that the prayers were fundamental in preventing this Hurricane from devastating Honduras and was benevolent to the people of Honduras.
