THERE'S ROOM FOR ALL IN OUR NEW TENT! Please reserve the canopy tent for church activities

You may have noticed our new and bright First Presbyterian Church burning bush event tent last weekend, set up by the circular stairway in the parking lot. It welcomed hundreds to FPC, many of them newcomers: Trunk or Treaters on Saturday afternoon, VOCES8 concert-goers that night, and Reformation/Presbyterian Heritage worshippers Sunday morning!

It is here for YOU to use at church, anywhere on campus where it can be

anchored in the grass, to welcome people to FPC and draw attention to whatever special event you are hosting. Church members and event organizers should consider putting up the tent during special holiday seasons or other happenings at the church, to take reservations, offer people a shady spot to sit or other uses. Be creative; maybe there is an FPC puppet troupe waiting to be born that needs a stage! It could also be used during community events where FPC needs a presence, such as the Pride Parade in June or other outdoor fairs. Your decorations and other signage can be strung to the loops on the canopy to add information and fun.

There are two things you need to do to reserve and request installation of the tent:

1) Email Building & Grounds Superintendent Johnny Miller at jmiller@fpcstpete.org at least one week in advance with your request, stating the date for installation and date for take down, and

2) Provide the name of a volunteer who can help put it up and take it down.

Johnny's hours are Monday – Thursday 8 a.m.-3 p.m. and Fridays 8 a.m-1 p.m. so you can coordinate your volunteer's availability with his. The tent pops up easily but it takes TWO people. Your volunteer simply will need to hold the corner poles on one side of the frame as Johnny opens it up to its full size, then help fasten the Velcro corners of the canopy. It is not heavy lifting! The tent can stay up for a few days but probably not more than a few weeks, especially if there are high winds, as months-long sun exposure and a blustery storm damaged the original tent when we were closed down for the pandemic.

Let's shout from the (tent) rafters that First Presbyterian has a lot going on!


Grieving? Know someone who is?
