From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

Dear Friends,

Well, it finally turned cool. Not cold. Come on...this is Florida. But it is cool, for sure.

I celebrated the coming cool weather by going out to weed my front garden, where the Sunshine Mimosa has grown in so well. It's a Florida native plant, good for birds and bugs and butterflies. I am thrilled it is flourishing from the three small plants I planted under the young live oak tree two years ago. Now Sunshine Mimosa has taken over half of the front circle. No need to mow there, so that's a win. Unfortunately weeds, sticky weeds, like to grow in with the Sunshine Mimosa, and that's a problem. I looked them up: they're called Beggarweeds. The little pods attach themselves to your clothes and take over. Fifteen minutes of productive weeding means two hours in the kitchen picking weeds off my clothes. Gee. It would be better to burn the clothes. Or I could weed in my bathing suit.

I guess I shouldn't have let the weeds get so thick. That would be one lesson to take from this. A garden needs on-going care, just as a church or a family or a pet or a friendship needs to be nurtured. And so does our faith, our friendship with God. We need to pay attention to what we are caring for, and what we might be neglecting. What are we letting grow in our garden when we're not looking? And how do we then get it all straightened out once again?

I'm not sure what my point is from all this chatter about weeds. But I do celebrate the cooler weather and I am glad to be out in the garden, even if I come in with some weeds to pick off.

Meanwhile, congratulations! You have elected a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC), a group of really good people. I believe this team will work together well. Please pray for them every day: Bryan, Don, April, Lynne, Chris, Kirby and Annie. Pray for their health, their energy, their insight, their patience. Pray for the work they will do, and for pray for the pastor candidates they will ultimately consider, especially the one God will bring to serve this church in coming years. Your prayers will help the PNC and their work.

WE CARE ABOUT CASA

"Stand Up to Silence" is the mantra of CASA in St. Petersburg. And First Presbyterian is designating our next Mission Sunday to help CASA fight and protect and comfort women and families who've been trapped in abusive situations. **November 12 is the date of our next Mission Sunday.** (We no longer call it "Fifth Sunday Mission" because of too many conflicting dates at our church.)

We need two main things from our membership: 1) Many hands to help pack

items for CASA to distribute to their clients and 2) Items to put into these packs or to give separately.

To pack these items, we will meet in Fellowship Hall on November 12, between 9 and 11 AM. So come when it's convenient for you. Members of the Mission Committee will be there to let you know what needs to be done. Light refreshments will be available. (Thank you, Fellowship Committee!)

CASA has approved the below items for adults and for children. If you bring these items in advance of November 12, buckets marked "For CASA" will be by the Giving Trees in each of the worship services. We will then pack the items below in hygiene bags on November 12.

ITEMS FOR WOMEN:

- Hairbrushes and combs
- Shampoo and conditioner
- Body wash
- Toothbrushes and toothpaste
- Deodorant

ITEMS FOR CHILDREN:

- Hairbrushes and combs
- Shampoo and conditioner
- Body wash
- Kids' toothbrushes and toothpaste

Other items not for packing but which are a Wish List of CASA's are shown below. If interested in getting any of these, you may bring them on November 12 or if in advance place them by the CASA buckets. (All should be new unless indicated otherwise):

- Air mattresses with pumps
- Blankets
- Bras/sports bras
- Socks for women and children
- Car seats (new or gently used and unexpired)
- Pack 'n Plays
- Strollers
- Umbrellas
- Accordion files
- Dish soap



If you're unfamiliar with CASA, its mission statement should help you understand what they do: "Challenging the societal acceptance of all forms of domestic violence, CASA stands up to silence through advocacy, prevention,

intervention, and support services. Our Vision: A society free from domestic violence."

According to CASA's website, some facts you may not realize:

- 1 in 3 women are victims of domestic violence.
- 1 in 4 men are victims of domestic violence.
- 1 in 15 children are exposed to intimate partner violence each year, and 90% of these children are eyewitnesses to this violence.
- 7 in 10 survivors reported that their abusers also targeted pets.


Card Fellowship Ministry

what it means to be a Presbyterian, a Christian, and a child of God! We don't have to have all the answers and solve all the problems, but we will be facilitating the discovery process!


