
## Lectio/Visio Divina

You are invited to a fun night of creative crafting, finger foods, and socializing!



## "Hope for Ukraine" Concert Planning: Success Beyond Our Imagination

An opportunity to host a Ukrainian world class Symphony Orchestra and Chorus and to offer financial help for their humanitarian aid to Ukrainian widows, orphans, and war

victims landed in our laps early this year. Members of our FPC congregation were excited and got to work planning for the event. Then it was postponed due to the lengthy process of applying for visas. The plans were put on the shelf.

Early this summer the concert was rescheduled. Plans were immediately taken off the shelf. Four task teams were formed and the successes to this point are beyond our imagination! The result is:

"Hope for Ukraine" Concert - free

An early decision was to have this as a community-wide outreach event, going beyond the membership of FPC to serve a critical need in a war-torn country.

*The Communications Task Team*, led by Mary Johnson, has done a mammoth job of publicizing to 57 pastors/churches, local neighbor newsletters and TV and radio stations. They have written the weekly articles in First News. The responses to each effort have been heartwarming.

The Donations Task Team, led by Al May, had the task of meeting our \$20,000 commitment to KSOC's humanitarian aid mission. 100% of donations will go to their work with widows, orphans, and war victims. Four weeks prior to the concert, donations have totaled \$19,212.00! The cause is a worthy one and donations will continue to come, including the freewill offering taken during the concert. The

need in Ukraine is beyond our imagination.

The Hospitality Task Team, led by Marilyn Mulcahy and Lynne Mormino, has planned in detail the welcoming and feeding of our guests. Many members have volunteered to donate food as well as preparing, serving, and cleaning-up after meals. Gift bags will include a selection of items reminding the musicians of their time with us.

The Housing Task Team, led by Ronn Johnson, has the task of securing 15 homes for the musicians. The KSOC women are paired with at least one who speaks English. Folks within our congregation as well as in the community have opened their homes to these women.

In addition to performing the concert, KSOC will be singing for the St. Pete Primary School kids on Monday morning, then travel to Gibbs High School to sing for the gifted singers there, then have a

free tour of the James Museum, a bus tour of downtown St. Petersburg by Sherry Oliver and Joan Karins, an All-American Bar-b-que dinner ala Kyle Brinkman, and a visit to Pass-a-Grille Beach to see the sunset! What a day for these special women!

*Still needed*: food, helping hands to prepare, serve, and clean-up after meals, financial donations for their humanitarian efforts, and for you to continue SPREADING THE WORD!
