When Can We Return? Breaking News Update

The Return to Church Team (Don Zegel, Gretchen Letterman, Karen Kisten, Karen Mossman, Kevin Clark, Matt Clear, and Tony McCoy, with input from Kyle Brinkman and Eva Popovich) has sent to the Session our updated draft of safety protocols and a big to-do list to get our campus ready for the day we can open our doors again.

Subject to Session approval, we will publicize the plan in detail at the end of this month for how we will begin to open for worship and other building uses. Tampa Bay's coronavirus positivity rate has been trending in the right direction, and we pray that continues, but we will not be able to set an opening date until the challenging list of tasks to be ready to return safely has been accomplished.

Once we are back in God's house, we will continue our online worship as well, with a hybrid of live streaming from the sanctuary and some pre-recorded elements. Stay tuned for more information, including how you might help get the church buildings ready.






