#### From the Mission Committee

The pressing needs in our city and county are endless, it seems. FPC and your Mission Committee would like to help all but we're focused primarily on three partnering groups where we can have as strong an impact as possible: 1) CASA (Community Action Stops Abuse; 2) the Free Clinic; and 3) Lakewood Elementary.

That said, the Giving Tree also hangs flush from time to time with needs from other organizations, such as those mentioned below. PLEASE REMEMBER: If you bring an item from the tree, attach the note with it.

#### Our Tree that Keeps on Giving

A big, big **Thank You** to our members and friends who keep giving to our Giving Tree requests. Mary-Linda Armacost reports that the Giving Tree has distributed all kinds of items to CASA, Happy Workers, Edible Peace Patch, and the Free Clinic. Items such as pull-ups, diapers, umbrellas, magic markers, gardening gloves, toilet paper, small backpacks, laundry detergent and spray starch, men's socks, boys and girls PJs, and much more. "It was quite a wonderful grouping," she says.

Mary-Linda also reports that Lakewood Elementary really appreciates the 80 uniforms that \$800 from your donations bought—40 uniforms for both girls and boys who could not afford one. A refresh on Lakewood's needs will soon be blooming again on our Giving Tree, so be on the lookout!



#### St. Pete Free Clinic

A big ask is that the Free Clinic sorely needs more volunteers. This is because of the Clinic's increased outreach via its new drive-thru food pantries, indoor services, and increased medical offerings. And the Clinic always needs more personal hygiene items, which you can place under the Giving Tree, designating them for the Free Clinic. Current volunteers from our church often talk about how fun and meaningful it is to get to know those in need of these services as well as the

other volunteers.

#### Honduras, Here We Come!

YAY! Finally, after three absent years, FPC will be sending a team to Honduras June 11-17, 2023, says Susan Schlecht. Because of COVID, the last year we were able to go was 2019. If you haven't noticed, our Little Free Library facing Beach Drive is attracting more and more families coming with their children to pick out books! Thanks, Ronn and Mary Johnson and team for conceiving and putting this library in place. Yet one more outreach into our neighborhood!

#### Things to Note

The Mission Committee also shares news with you that it hears from other local non-profit groups. Here are a few:



- Lynne Mormino shares that Clothes to Kids is actively assisting homeless children in Pinellas County Schools. She cites an online *Catalyst* story that says more than 3,000 children are homeless in our county, and that number is expected to grow. - One of <u>Operation PAR/COSA's</u> programs focuses on helping children whose mothers or other family caretakers have drug or other addictions. They run a pre-school for kids up to age 5. This program needs books and money.
- Our Afghan refugee neighbors are getting settled into our community and others around the state with the assistance of Westminster Communities and Lutheran Services. FPC members and friends are currently helping with transportation and teaching English.
- Pastor Ginny Ellis reports that Bethel continues to do wonderful work in south Hillsborough, and that Cedarkirk had over 500 campers this summer, after re-opening from COVID closures. Cedarkirk also stages "road show" camps lasting five days that are proving to be quite popular.


