We welcome Rev. Ginny Simmons Ellis! Rev. Ellis started as the temporary stated supply pastor this week and will continue working with First Presbyterian Church until we hire an interim pastor and complete our other work in support of the session and the church. The interim pastor search continues as the ministry information form was completed and approved by the Presbytery of Tampa Bay Commission on Ministry. We are now scheduling our first interviews for the coming week.

A Note from Rev. Ginny Ellis, Temporary Stated Supply Pastor

I have begun my work as Temporary Supply Pastor at First Presbyterian Church of St. Petersburg. I met some of you last Sunday and have been in Zoom meetings with some of you. But this is to greet you as a group. I am eager to speak personally with each of you!

Let me introduce myself a bit. I grew up in Jacksonville, the second of five children. We were members of the Arlington Presbyterian Church where I sang in the Children's and then the Youth Choirs. College took me to the Atlanta area, to study philosophy at Agnes Scott College, with a Junior Year abroad in Aberdeen, Scotland (very cold for a Floridian!). I worked in north Georgia (Dalton) for two years, and then attended Columbia Seminary, marrying Harry Ellis in 1976, graduating in 1978.

We came to St. Petersburg in 1978

when Harry joined the Physics faculty at Eckerd College. I was ordained in 1980 as an interim pastor, serving five churches in five years. I then became pastor at Bayshore Presbyterian in Tampa, where I served as solo pastor for 19 years. After leaving Bayshore in 2004, I have served in a variety of transitional pastorates.



Here at First Church, I will offer leadership in worship, in administration, and in pastoral care. I also hope to help the church find stability and confidence by listening to absolutely everyone. With that in mind, I invite you to consider how I can meet with you: on the phone or over Zoom, at a coffee shop, in the church conference room, or coming to sit on your patio. I am mindful of the need to wear masks and keep safe distances, but I am sure we can find safe ways to engage in ministry and in community together.

From the Return to Church Task Force

Greetings Friends:

We hope this message finds you blessed by God and in fine emotional and physical health. For those of you who have been struggling with illness or loss, our love and prayers are with you.

For some time now, the Return to Church Task Force has been meeting regularly, reviewing the recent COVID data available, and keeping up with advancements in science and CDC guidelines. We are a very dedicated Task Force and take seriously our charge to protect the health and safety of those who enter our doors for worship and other church activities.

Recently, as the COVID-19 Delta variant surged and the CDC returned to its earlier advice for individuals to wear masks indoors, we took the same extra step to reinstate the required mask policy at our church. It proved to be the right call, with Delta variant cases rising significantly in September.

Even though the data are beginning to show daily case counts decreasing, the number of daily cases in Pinellas County is still extremely high. Consequently the mask policy will remain in place at FPC as the Task Force continues to monitor the case numbers. As our Chancel Choir returns from its summer break, members will not process or recess and will wear masks as they sing.

The Task Force will continue to pray for the safety and health of all our congregation, families and staff, and for continued decrease in cases and positivity trends. We will keep you informed.

Please note we will NOT be meeting next Tuesday (9/21), and will extend the study through October 5.




