From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

Dear Friends,

Remember: This Sunday afternoon: 4:00 to 5:30: Preparing to Sail!

I hope many of you will meet with me in the Fellowship Hall (downstairs, opening off the back parking lot) for the first of three conversations. With this first conversation we will look at who we are at present and what we are feeling good about. It won't be all sitting to listen, not a 90-minute sermon: I promise. You'll get to move around and to talk.

In the background of Sunday's conversation are a couple of things the Session approved on Monday evening:

 First, they approved the lease extension for St. Pete Primary School. This is a multi-year lease that takes the school through school year 26-27, four more years.

- Second, the Session approved the final report of the Strategic Property Task Force, which was charged in January 2023 to look at the full range of options for our church property. The approved report says the following: After prayer, study, and consultation, the Strategic Property Task Force finds that our Finances, Membership, and Leadership are in much a stronger position than when we began this task, therefore the Task Force recommends that no specific action be taken regarding the church property at this time. If you have questions about this we can talk about it on Sunday afternoon, but it felt like good news to the Session.
- Third, the Session called a Congregational Meeting for the election of a PNC (Pastor Nominating Committee), the meeting to be held after each worship service on October 15. I will add the good Presbyterian phrase: *if the way be clear*. I hope you will be there.

There is much happening here at the church: new classes, new events, new members, new energy. We hope you are finding ways to be part of it all: making new friends, connecting in new ways, praying for the future as we await the winds of the Holy Spirit to power this ship on its way.

During the month of October, we will be collecting





- 2 Zoom meetings with local news media and Ukraine Chorus members
- 2 dinners in Fellowship Hall and 2 sack lunches (sacks decorated by the Primary School children!)
- 15 host families
- 6 back-up host families
- 28 gifted Ukrainian musicians and their exuberant conductor
- 1 day of pleasure and fun following the concert for our guests, hosts, and FPC family
- Singing to the children and hearing the children sing
- Singing with the PCCA Girls' Choir at Gibbs High School
- A complimentary tour of the James Museum
- A bus tour of downtown St Petersburg
- A BBQ dinner with hosts and other guests in Fellowship Hall
- An evening at Pass-A-Grille Beach, complete with ice cream sandwiches, gentle waves, and a brilliant sunset
- The power of God's Spirit moving in all of us as we worked together in community.

The crowd of 1000+ applauded, cheered, and gave standing ovations. It was the largest crowd in memory for many of us.

The current donation amount is – drumroll please - **\$48,866** – and more keeps coming! Greg, the KSOC's CEO said that it is an historic amount in tour gifts. Every penny will be used for KSOC's humanitarian aid for widows, orphans, war victims, and their new project – PTSD treatment, thus helping those with physical, spiritual, and/or mental needs.

Thank you for your part in making this successful and thanks be to our God for this loving gift of community.
